The Twenty-sixth Session of the Bay of Quinte Annual Conference, commencing at 10 a. m., on the 26th day of May, 1869, was held in the York Street M. E. Church, Ottawa City.

PASTORAL ADDRESS.

TO THE MEMBERS OF THE M. E. CHURCH IN CANADA, IN CONNECTION WITH THE BAY QUINTE ANNUAL CONFERENCE.

DEAR BRETHREN,—Through the mercy of the Divine Being we have been permitted to assemble in our Annual Conference; to you all we accord once more our earnest Christian greeting. God has graciously preserved the lives and health of the ministers.

The vastness of the work to which we have been called we apprehend; our insufficiency, unaided by grace, for its accomplishment we have proved; the necessity for your Christian sympathy, most effectual prayer, and hearty co-operation we feel. Therefore, confiding in God, and relying upon your Christian integrity, we hope to prosecute successfully the work of the Master.

We earnestly commend to your notice the interests of the different institutions of the Church. The welfare of these institutions is inseparably connected with the weal of the Church and our beloved country. The perpetuation of their existence and efficiency must depend largely upon the support they receive from you. Make them centres of intellectual and moral strength and sources of influences that shall refine, ennoble and save men.

Let the Sabbath-schools of the Church receive your attention and care. Do not recognize them simply as institutions designed to effect some good, but as preventives of evil and nurseries of the Church of Christ. Give not only your sympathies and prayers, but your presence and your cordial support. The Sabbath school opens a field of useful labor. It gives you access to the tender and susceptible hearts of the youth. Through it you are furnished with the privilege of training the young for honorable lives, triumphant deaths, and everlasting bliss.

Confine not your efforts for the present good and eternal welfare of men to your own family, or the particular neighborhood in which you live. Take a higher and nobler view of your duties to your fellow men. Let no local circumstance circumscribe your range of vision. Adopt the motto, "Do good unto all men." Employ it not only as a motto, but as a motive. Let the influence of such a motive upon your hearts find open and practical development in your liberal contributions for the support of our missionary work. Allow us to urge earnestly its claims upon you. The field is extensive.—Demands are pressing; perishing men call upon us to help them. The call can only be complied with when your financial response is noble, generous and Christian-like. Observe that the success or

failure of the work depends largely upon you. Come, then, to its aid, in strong faith, with true hearts and liberal souls. Let your donations be indicative of the warmth and purity of your zeal, of the sincerity of your professions of good will to man and of the depth and earnestness of your love to Christ.

The *C. C. Advocate* demands your support; your loyalty to the Church of your choice cannot be better evinced than by subscribing for our connexional journal. Its religious department cannot fail to bring good to every household into which it is introduced. Its political department is all that could be expected in a religious periodical. Every member of the Church requires the paper, since it is the vehicle of information respecting the general working of the Church. To feel interested in the welfare of any organization an individual must be acquainted with its operations. That your interests may be more fully identified with the interests of the Church, acquaint yourselves through the medium of the paper with its doings. Subscribe for it yourselves; labor to introduce it into the families that surround you; become agents in its behalf.

Through the praiseworthy efforts of Professor Wild, our College occupies a most favorable position. In a few weeks it will stand free of all financial embarrassments. The payment of the debt, however, does not relieve you from obligation to support it. There is yet room for judicious outlay upon the College and its surroundings. Its Museum requires enlargement; the number of volumes in the Library ought to be greatly multiplied; both these departments of the College you may do much for by care and attention. Strive to multiply the number of its students. Direct the attention of your friends to its facilities for imparting a sound and liberal education. Furnish students from your own families. Remember that a good education is the best temporal legacy you can bestow upon your children. Let your own College, in your support, patronage, and affection take precedence of all others. As citizens, patriots, philanthropists, and Christians our College has claims upon you; meet those claims as men true to the College, the Church, and the country.

Again we urge upon you the necessity of increasing the amount of the salaries paid your ministers. The great advance in the price of the common and indispensable articles of subsistence make it necessary. The demand for a well informed ministry must be met; the preacher ought always to be intellectually in advance of his people. He cannot be unless you provide him with the means requisite to procure books, magazines, &c. We recommend that the plans and suggestions of your District Conventions be acted upon as far as practicable.

Adopt some efficient policy ; let the finances of your Circuits be systematically managed, and then they will be successfully managed. Finally, brethren, "Remember the Sabbath day to keep it holy." Forget not the assembling of yourselves together ; use the different means of grace to the glory of God and your spiritual improvement. Be foremost in every good work. "Watch ye ; stand fast in the faith ; quit you like men ; be strong."

REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON EDUCATION.

TO THE BAY QUINTE ANNUAL CONFERENCE IN CONFERENCE ASSEMBLED:

Your Committee to whom was entrusted the subject of Education beg leave to report:

Upon examination of the Annual exhibit submitted by the Rev. G. Shepard, Treasurer of Albert University, we find the College financially involved to the amount of \$16,171.31.

That subscriptions of former years together with centenary subscriptions make assets in its favor to the amount of \$5,239.00.

That Rev. J. Wild has received a conditional subscription amounting to \$10,930.00.

That a loan has been obtained from the Canada Permanent Building and Saving Society of \$6,000.00.

Could the subscriptions now due be collected there would be a balance in favor of the institution of \$4,997.49.

The thanks of the Church are due Prof. Wild for the successful accomplishment of the work he voluntarily undertook. It is highly desirable that all the subscribers should forward at once the amounts subscribed; the surplus resulting from prompt payment of the subscription can be profitably expended to increase the efficiency of the school. Upon the removal of the present liabilities the proposed endowment scheme will be heartily entered into.

We solicit the patronage of the public, and particularly the Church. A degree in Arts can be secured as economically as in any institution in the land. The Primary Department and Ladies' College offer superior advantages.

From the preceding considerations it is resolved,

1. That we will use our best endeavors to collect the old subscriptions and centenary offerings to the College.

2. That we will labor to induce the subscribers secured by Rev. J. Wild to make immediate remittances.

3. That we pledge ourselves to raise our proportion of the annual amount required to meet the loan from the Canada Permanent Building and Saving Society.

4. That we urge the claims of the College upon the public.

5. That we will labor to make the proposed endowment scheme a success.

6. That we approve of the Conference Scholarship scheme.

7. That we strive to increase the amount of the College collection.

REPORT ON SABBATH SCHOOLS.

Your Committee to whom was referred the subject of Sabbath schools beg leave to report as follows:

That, so far as we have been provided with instruction, there is a decrease in the report of about twenty-five per cent. Some of the fields have not been reported at all; others, only in part. Several

have more Union Schools than any others; thus affording no information for the public above that obtained from other sources. The report upon the whole represents the work in a deplorable condition.

Resolutions have been repeatedly passed requiring sermons and lectures, to be delivered by the ministers, bearing upon the subject, and other laudable efforts to promote the Sabbath-school enterprise; but it appears evident to your Committee, these have not been generally carried out.

We find this God-honoring work is demanding the special attention of almost all churches in civilization. The most giant intellects that can be found in America are applied to give efficiency to its working. Circuit, District, Provincial and State Conventions are being held, and attracting the multitudes to them, for the purpose of devising means for greater proficiency in carrying out this work. Shall we, as a body of ministers, be unmindful of this part of our duty? If we are, "Ichabod" will soon be written (and justly too) upon the walls of our churches.

There is not a field of labor now occupied by us, but what can have one or more efficient denominational schools, and a Bible class, if the minister give his attention to this work. Why are the non-Protestant, as well as those who are Protestant, whose dogmas we ignore, so tenacious of their rights? Simply because the children are catechised at their homes, and in Sabbath-schools, so thoroughly as to rivet their loved tenets so firmly upon the tender mind as not to allow time or circumstance to obliterate them. Shall we attach blame to them? Never. Rather let us follow their praiseworthy example: Do we complain of barriers? What almost insurmountable ones hedged up the way of Hannah Ball, the founder of the Sabbath-schools. With what earnestness did Robert Raikes betake himself to the task of aiding with his press and addresses. Have the efforts ever proved a failure? Let the cause of Christianity for the century since its foundation be heard. It will speak loudly of the amount of good accomplished by the origin, and working of the British and Foreign Bible Society, as well as the thousands saved through its instrumentality.

Let no man's heart fail him; let us rise in our might, gather in the children, catechise them at our homes, and organize schools, if we can get but ten or twelve to attend. Hold fruit festivals, picnics, children's concerts, and give prize-books, in order to stimulate the children to activity. Hold Circuit or District Conventions for the consolidation of the work.

Resolved, therefore, that as a body of ministers, we solemnly pledge ourselves to do all in our power, in the fear of God, for the carrying out of the above suggestions and the greater proficiency of the Sabbath-school enterprise.

SABBATH OBSERVANCE.

Your Committee on Sabbath Observance beg leave to report as follows:

The Sabbath brings man face to face with God—with his soul's immortality. It is the day of days, as our Bible is the Book of books, and our God the God of gods. Creation and redemption, its origin; its aim is endless rest. The Christian should keep the Sabbath because God commands it; the infidel should keep it, in common with the lower orders of animals, because his physical constitution demands it.

The idea is that of rest—rest from bodily and mental labor, by ceasing from the one, and by directing the mind into new channels of thought to secure the other. From all servile work or anything leading to it, or having even the appearance of it, we should refrain. Corporations or Companies, with servants public or private, who are sometimes inclined to ignore the responsibility of their acts, are equally reprehensible as the private citizen if they desecrate the Lord's Day.

But the Sabbath day should be kept holy. Consecrated time should be devoted to the interests of the soul. Religious services are recreative, and elevating in their tendencies as well. These, especially on the Sabbath day, should be observed, to the exclusion of those amusements which cannot be taken in the name of the Lord Jesus. And the life and teaching of every Gospel minister, with every disciple of the Saviour, should most clearly attest his

belief in its divine origin, its sacred character and its noble ends. In a word, we regard the Sabbath, at least the manner of its observance, as a sure index of a nation's or an individual's true prosperity. In view, therefore, of the importance of this institution—its bearing upon our temporal and eternal welfare—your Committee would earnestly urge upon all who would see the world grow better day by day, not to forget our day of days, day of all the week the best emblem of eternal rest.

STATE OF THE CHURCH.

A Committee on the State of the Church was appointed by the Conference, which brought before the Conference in their report a variety of suggestions relating to the inadequate stipends of our ministers, the present condition of our Sabbath-schools, pastoral work, best method of promoting revivals, &c., &c., and recommended that these subjects should be discussed in open Conference. This recommendation was adopted. Several laymen present were invited to take part in the discussion. A part of two subsequent sessions was thus employed, and the following resolutions adopted:

1. That the amount estimated for the pastor's support on each Circuit, by the committee appointed for that purpose, be fairly divided and apportioned—where the Circuit embraces more than one—to each congregation according to ability.

2. That two stewards, or others, for each congregation, be appointed by the Estimating Committee, to circulate a subscription among all members of the Church and congregation, payable in weekly, monthly or quarterly instalments—our preference being with the first—and that these persons so appointed be required to pay to the Circuit Treasurer, on the first of each month all funds for pastoral support in their hands.

3. That a Circuit Treasurer be appointed by the Estimating Committee at their first meeting in the ecclesiastical year, and that he pay over to the pastor on the first of or early in each month, whatever funds may have been collected from the various congregations, except in cases where the amount so collected exceeds that proportion of stipend then due, or where the Committee or Quarterly Meeting Conference may stipulate advance payment.

Conventions as given below were appointed for the consideration of the remaining topics suggested in the above report.

CONVENTIONS.

No. 1.—Composed of the various Circuits of the County of Prince Edward. F. B. Stratton, convener.

No. 2.—Napanee, Bay Quinte, Camden, Tamworth and Denbigh. J. D. Bell, convener.

No. 3.—Odessa, Kingston, Wolf Island, Loughboro', Inverary, Verona and Kennebec. L. A. Betts, convener.

No. 4.—Sherbrook, Elgin, Lyndhurst, Farmersville and Rideau. F. Chisholm, convener.

No. 5.—Gananoque, Mallorytown, Lyn, Brookville and Augusta. J. Ferguson, convener.

No. 6.—Edwardsburg, Matilda, Inkerman, Winchester, Aultsville and Newington. J. Halliwell, Convener.

No. 7.—Ottawa East and West, Riceville, Bell's Corners and Huntly. B. Lane, B. A., convener.

No. 8.—Egansville, Arnprior, Renfrew, Westmeath and Combermere. A. Dawson, P. E., convener.

The following resolutions were also adopted:

1. That the subjects to be discussed at the above Conventions be, 1st. What is the best method by which revivals of religion may be promoted. 2nd. The best method of conducting and teaching Sabbath schools. 3rd. How shall pastoral work be most profitably performed.

2. That each preacher attending the Convention come prepared to read an essay, or deliver an address on one or other of the above themes.

3. That the chief business of these Conventions be to promote the spiritual interests of the Church.

4. That these Conventions be composed of all the Preachers, travelling and local, Exhorters, Leaders, Stewards, Sabbath-school Superintendents and teachers, and a deputation of two from each congregation within their bounds.

5. That these Conventions be held before the 1st of October, at the time and place the preacher convening shall deem most expedient.

REPORT ON PRINTING.

Your Committee on Printing beg leave to report that after examining the report of the Auditing Committee on the printing establishment they are of the opinion that the purchase of the new press has been a great advantage to the concern.

The amount of work done and the balance of profit on the transactions of the year ending Feb. 23th 1869, are very satisfactory to your Committee, and creditable to the editor and agent.

Your Committee would suggest that our connexional paper be taken and read by the official and other members of the Church on each Circuit, and would therefore recommend that the P. E., at the first Q. M., on each Circuit, urge its necessity and secure, if possible, the subscriptions of the official members at least. We would also recommend that the preachers of this Conference take a deeper interest in the prosperity of the printing establishment, and do all in their power to increase the number of subscribers.

Your Committee find that there is a debt of \$150 yet remaining on the press, and recommend that each preacher in charge be required to raise \$2 on his Circuit to liquidate the debt, those excepted who have already paid the amount required.

We would also recommend that all debts due by the preachers of this Conference to the concern, for books, paper, &c., be paid as soon as possible.

We beg to suggest most respectfully to the editor that the printing of the date of issue on each page of the paper would be a great convenience to the reader.

We farther recommend that our ministers and members in purchasing S. S. Libraries and catechisms, &c., patronize the Book Room of the M. E. Church.

REPORT ON TEMPERANCE.

Your Committee beg leave to report,

That notwithstanding all that has been said and done against the use of alcoholic drinks as a beverage, the same evil still exists to an alarming extent, and it becomes our duty to again utter our most solemn protest against the use and sale of a poison so ruinous and fatal in its effects, not only upon the thousands who are at present concerned in its sale and use; but upon the rising and growing population of this rising and growing country. Who can estimate the widespread ruin which follows in its path. But while we look with regret and alarm at the results of so foul a traffic, in its millions of victims, both for time and eternity, we have much reason for thankfulness and encouragement in view of the change which has taken place through the agency of the different temperance organizations even within the last half century.

The time was when the use of intoxicating drinks at all public gatherings, whether joyous or grievous, among the rich and the poor, was looked upon in the light of innocent gratification and amusement, notwithstanding its evil influence on the young and the shameful results that followed. Now it is otherwise among a large, respectable and growing portion of society.

Though much has been done, the alarming prevalence of the evil should prompt us to continued and increased action. Nor should we rest until this Dominion has a prohibitory law, so that wicked men shall not be allowed, simply for the purpose of transferring the pittance of the poor and the fortunes of the rich into their own coffers, to sell more freely than bread a poison which makes men neglect their families, ruin themselves, and forget their God.

Our young people are not safe while there are men who, supported by law, are willing for the sake of gain to lead the young and inexperienced into the path of evil.

Many of our young converts are in like danger, and hundreds would have been in the Church to-day, living, working Christian men, who by our efforts have been brought to Christ; but who, in consequence of the frequency with which they were almost compelled to look upon it, have been drawn back again into the channel of their old habits, and are now in drunkards' graves, or in disgrace and poverty are reeling onward to the place where the abused spirit shall be separated from the bloated body until the books are opened on the Judgment Day.

Resolved, therefore, that we as ministers of the Gospel and members of the Bay of Quinte Annual Conference, will, by precept, practice and effort, do all we can within the bounds of our prescribed fields of labor, to put down and suppress this worst of evils.

We also recommend that the request of the Canada Temperance Union be complied with, and that two delegates be appointed by this Conference, to attend its next session, to be held at Toronto in the month of September next.

ADDRESS TO SIR JOHN YOUNG.

The following address from the Bay of Quinte Conference was presented to his Excellency, Sir John Young, on Tuesday the 1st inst., by a deputation consisting of Bishop Richardson, Rev. S. G. Stone, Secretary of the Conference, and Rev.'s J. W. Sills and J. Halliwell :

**TO HIS EXCELLENCY THE RIGHT HONORABLE SIR JOHN YOUNG,
BART., &c., &c., GOVERNOR-GENERAL OF THE DOMINION OF
CANADA :**

May it please your Excellency, the Bishops and members of the Bay Quinte Annual Conference of the Methodist Episcopal Church in Canada, now in Conference assembled, desire to congratulate your Excellency on your appointment as Governor of the Dominion. We have not been unmindful of those long and important services which you have rendered in other parts of Her Most Gracious Majesty's Dominions, and in giving you to us, at this most important juncture of our position as a people, we recognize again that paternal care which the Imperial Government has ever exercised over the welfare of this most favored colony, and are assured that the ties which bind us to the throne of a beloved Sovereign are never likely to be broken. As the representatives of a large section of the people of this Province, we assure your Excellency that the dearest sentiment of our hearts is a united empire, perpetuated under the happy and glorious institutions with which a kind Providence has favored us. The province of our duties lies mainly in the moral and religious training of the people committed to our care, but next to our devotion, we regard unaffected loyalty as the noblest principle of the human heart, and in laying the expression of our devotion at your feet, we feel assured that the cares and toils that must often oppress you will be lightened by the consciousness that you rule a loving and devoted people. In commending you to the care of the God of our fathers, our prayer is that your sojourn amongst us may be as happy to yourself as it is grateful to us.

His Excellency replied as follows :

**TO THE BISHOPS AND MEMBERS OF THE BAY OF QUINTE ANNUAL
CONFERENCE OF THE METHODIST EPISCOPAL CHURCH :**

GENTLEMEN,—I feel flattered by your attention in offering me your congratulations on my appointment to the honorable post of Governor-General of Canada. I rejoice to dwell upon the sentiment to which you give expression of unaffected loyalty to the Queen, and of thorough contentment with the institutions under which you live. But recently those institutions have been held up in becoming terms of praise by a Canadian writer who pronounces them to be as good

a form of government as any that exists in the world, combining the advantages both of a monarchy and of a republican system, without the disadvantages incident to either the one or the other. I trust that the people of British North America will long continue to enjoy and appreciate the blessing which Providence has vouchsafed them. The foundations of the new Dominion have been prosperously laid. For the future progress and maintenance of the work, reliance must be laid, not on human exertions alone, but mainly, and before all else, on the truth that "Righteousness exalteth a nation." In this point of view, the province which you occupy is of the most vital importance, that of inculcating the lesson of Christian wisdom, of training numbers of the youth of the country in the paths of peace and virtue, and teaching them to unite complete toleration with steadfast adherence to principle; and the manly assertion of their own independence, with unfeigned respect for the rights and opinions of others.

TEMPORAL ECONOMY.

The Committee on Temporal Economy submit the following estimates of Contingent and Superannuated Fund and Bishop's claim to the different Charges in Bay Quinte Annual Conference:



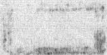

FOR THE YEAR ENDING MAY, 1860



INTRODUCTION.

In presenting their Annual Report the Missionary Board would devoutly acknowledge the guiding hand of Providence. With gratitude we record the preservation of the lives of all our missionaries, and note the success of their labors. Many of the fields are large, labor consequently great, and travel extensive; yet toil has not been in vain. Souls have been converted to God and additions made to our numbers. Church property has increased, Sabbath Schools have been established and maintained, and the religious oversight of the young taken. Our connexional paper, the *C. C. Advocate*, has, in some instances, been fairly circulated, and there is increased desire for religious and general information. The Bible has been diffused, Bible doctrines taught, its spirit imbibed, and blessings enjoyed. The amount contributed for missions is in advance of last year, and we give glory to God and thanks to our patrons for this success.

We now subjoin a particular report of the respective mission stations.

GANANOQUE.

This mission during the past year has shared largely in temporal and spiritual prosperity. A neat, commodious and well finished church in Gananoque has been erected and paid for; also provisions have been made for increased improvements in church property. It has been favored with a gracious revival of religion, resulting in the addition of 71 to the membership. All financial claims have been met. With care and God's blessing this will soon become a choice field of labor.

WOLFE ISLAND

Has enjoyed some prosperity—chiefly financial. At the village of Marysville the missionary has of late preached weekly, on Wednesday evenings,—the only additional appointment. \$27.05 have been raised for Sabbath Schools and \$100 for missions, the latter amount far exceeding that of any previous year, and the same can be said of the sums paid to the P. Elder and Bishop. 15 new subscribers have been obtained for the *C. C. Advocate*, and much collected from old subscribers. In a word, upwards of \$760 have been or will be soon paid for the various connexional purposes. Membership 72.

INKERMAN,

Recently separated from Matilda Circuit, is increasing in importance and membership, yet still requires aid from the Society.

NEWINGTON

Embraces parts of the townships of Osnabuck, Finch, Roxboro and Cornwall. The country is level and fertile, and the roads are excellent. There are 8 appointments, 4 classes, 134 members, also good congregations. The estimated value of the two churches and parsonage is \$2,400. There are two prosperous S. Schools, ably and efficiently officered. The missionary has traveled 1850 miles and preached 158 times during the year. The mission is rapidly rising.

RICEVILLE.

This Mission still continues a hard field; but during the year the Lord visited this part of Zion in mercy. The prospects of our Church are very good.

HUNTLY.

The missionary says: "One important appointment has been added.—The trustees of the Stone Church (Union) at Bell's Corners kindly opened the same, thus enabling us to visit regularly. The parsonage property has been improved, also 16 additions made to the membership during the last quarter. All the connexional claims brought before the people were paid, the minister and P. Elder each receiving more than during any previous year. Huntly bids fair to become a good circuit."

TAMWORTH

Spiritually and temporally is healthy, and commendable interest is manifested in regard to Sabbath Schools.

VERONA

Has 8 appointments, 3 local preachers, 1 exhorter and a full Board of Stewards. One appointment has been taken up and 20 added to the Church during the year; yet, owing to 3 deaths, 9 removals, and other losses, there is an actual increase of but 5. Membership 108; also 2 Sabbath Schools.

KENNEBEC

Embraces the townships of Kennebec, Olden and part of Hinchinbrook.—The year just past has been one of unusual scarcity. The partial failure of

crops, the great depth and long continuance of the snow, made it difficult for many to provide the necessaries of life. Notwithstanding there has been advancement in our financial department. An old debt of \$40, of long standing against the Arden Chapel Building Committee, has been paid, also a half acre of land has been purchased in the same village and a small frame house erected thereon; all nearly paid for. At the first Quarterly Meeting Conference one appointment was detached from this and attached to Sherbrooke, which weakened this in finances and membership. However one new appointment was taken up in Hinchinbrook. We have six S. Schools, showing that the young are not neglected; also about 20 have united in Church fellowship.

SHERBROOKE

Embraces the townships of Sherbrooke, Oso, Olden, Dalhousie and Bedford. Has 12 appointments, 1 chapel and a parsonage in course of erection, with fair prospects of completion. The friends are willing to do all they can to sustain their minister. The missionary travels one hundred miles over rough roads in passing around his charge. Prospects fair.

KALADAR

Has an increase of 10 members, and spiritually is healthy. It is a poor agricultural country, and the past year was exceedingly hard financially. Although some are in comfortable circumstances, yet the majority are very poor, so that it can truly be said, "The poor have the gospel preached to them."

WESTMEATH.

Here we have abundance of opposition, and in consequence some reverses; yet there are noble, generous, loyal hearts, and with care this may become a good field of labor. Membership 52.

DENBIGH AND MISSISSIPPI

Embraces, in whole or in part, the townships of Denbigh, Abinger, Griffith, Mattawatchen, Miller, Clarendon, Palmerston and Cananto. There are 3 occasional and 8 regular appointments; two of the latter have been established during the year. Seven members and 18 probationers have been added; yet, on account of removals and other causes, no great increase is reported. Owing to the perfect failure of crops, finances are low. A frame parsonage has been erected, which will be easily completed and paid for. There is one frame Church nearly finished and another in course of erection. The mission, spiritually, is prosperous; congregations good; people very liberal and truly attached to our Church. A large, hard, yet growing field.

EGANVILLE

Is an old field. One new appointment has been established during the year, which bids fair to become the best on the charge. There are 5 Sabbath appointments with good congregations, and a church and parsonage on this field.
