

The regulations are not much changed, but made a little more stringent. The Committee recommended that John McKinney be appointed a special constable to look after the licensed taverns in the Parish of Lancaster, at a salary of \$200. The appointment was made.

Justice Gerow moved that Mr. George Sculler be appointed as Tavern Inspector for Simonson and St. Martins, the committee believing that one person could discharge the duties for the two Parishes. The salary was fixed at \$600 per year on motion of Justice Milligan.

Justice Moore called attention to the fact that the charges against the tavern keepers must be investigated before the Parish Magistrates, and the difficulty in sustaining charges by a person who does not live in the district.

The Bill Committee was authorized to prepare a bill to go before the Legislature to enable charges to be investigated before Justice Thayer.

A communication from John Heavey, of Musquash, asking pay for breaking roads at Musquash, which the Commissioner refused, was referred to Justice Knight and Clinch.

Justice Thompson asked that the Committee on Lancaster Accounts be again called together. He said Constable Lake felt aggrieved and wanted to submit his account to the committee. The Commissioner refused to do so. Justice Thompson said he had visited the crusher near by would supply labor for the prisoners. The goal was too good a boarding house.

A committee consisting of Justice Gerow, Thompson and Moore was appointed to arrange for labor.

The County Treasurer submitted the names of Rev. Canon Scovill and W. H. Hill, Esq., as his bondsmen, and the Clerk was ordered to prepare a report on June 20.

LONDON, June 19.

The missing Earl of Yarborough was found in Jersey, one of the Channel Isles, quite ill. He was expected in London last night in charge of his friends and police. The vessel lately lost in the China sea, and not the bark Scotland, as was supposed.

The wife of Don Carlos has arrived at Paris en route to Switzerland. Yellow fever is raging at Bahia. French detectives are in London watching Kioefetz.

PARIS, June 19.

The Municipal bill was defeated in the Assembly yesterday. Negotiations are said to be in progress for the formation of a new majority. The Left, the Bonapartists and a portion of the Right Centre voted with the majority. They regarded the clause as an attempt to restrict universal suffrage.

At a reception of Cardinals by the Pope, Tuesday, his holiness mentioned that proposals had been received from exalted political personages, looking to a reconciliation between the papacy and Italian Government. He declared, however, he would yield nothing, and that any concession on that point would be injurious to the Church and society.
