Shipping Notes. The brig Ethel Bolton, Swain master, from Pernambuco for Portland with sugar, 82 days out, which put into New York on the 21st inst.

The bark Kate Stanton, Oliver master, from Barrow, E., with railroad iron, for this port, before reported as having put into Digby, N. S., in distress, has at length arrived here, having been detained at that port over two weeks.

The bark Hawk, Robbins, master, which sailed here for Queenstown on the 24th inst., put back the same evening, having encountered head winds. She sailed again yesterday.

The steamer Georgia, about a dozen wreckers are trying to save some of the cargo of the steamer Georgia, but the probability is that it will be almost totally lost.

The new brigantine Etowah, Ogilvie master, at Mr. J. G. Jordan to load for Carriacas at 16 cents. She was built by Mr. John Dart, at Green Oak, Colchester, a handsomely modelled vessel, thoroughly iron keel, copper fastened up to 12 feet, and sailed, and classes A 1 English Lloyd's 7 years.
