Thousands of Lives Lost

MADRID, Oct. 21. - A despatch received here from Leyte, one of the Philippine Islands, says that place has been almost devastated by a cyclone; that many persons have been killed and that the damage to property is incalculable.

The cyclone destroyed the towns of Tagloban and Hernali, on the island of Leyte, as well as several villages. It is estimated that 400 persons lost their lives through the disaster.

The later advices from Manila say the cyclone occurred on Oct. 12 and that Burang, on the eastern coast of Leyte, has been wiped out, and that an immense wave swept inland, engulfing villages. Several thousand natives perished at Tagloban. The cyclone also swept the island of Samar.

The full extent of the catastrophe is not yet known. The town of Leyte, however, sustained but little damage contrary to the reports received.

Kentville, N. S. Oct. 24. - The Buckley of Birge Corner, was found in his house on Saturday morning with a bullet hole in his head and a revolver in one chamber empty lying by his side.

NEWS NOTES.

The drought of the last three years cost New South Wales thousands of head of cattle and 25,500 sheep. The prospects of agriculture are now better, the wheat area extending over a million acres, according to Premier Reid's statement in the Assembly.

The annual report of General Dumont, Supervising Inspector-General of Steam Vessels, shows that approximately 650,000 passengers were carried on steam vessels during the year, and that the number of accidents resulting in loss of life was only twenty-six.

The work on the extension of the Baie des Chaleurs Railway from Caplin to Paspébiac is progressing rapidly. The steamer Forest House was to arrive at New Carlisle on Saturday, with 2000 tons of rails for the work. The grading will be completed by November 1.

It is reported that Lord Strathcona and Mount Royal and Sir Edwin Davies of the British India Steam Navigation Co., have joined the board of directors of the proposed fast Atlantic steamship company, with the Marquis of Lorne as chairman.

A great enterprise has just been completed in Newfoundland - the completion of the trans-insular railway, extending completely across the island from St. John's on the east to Port au Basques at the extreme southwest, fifty miles from Cap Breton. The total mileage is about 615 and the cost is \$15,800 per mile, a total of \$9,954,000.

The Governor General intends visiting Campbellton on Thursday next.

The Lunenburg Argus gives the names of fishing vessels arriving in that port in June and July. They aggregate 116,000 quintals, which, at \$2.00 per quintal, the present cash value, makes the nice little sum of \$232,000 to be distributed in that enterprise town.

One hundred and seventy-four vessels call from Lunenburg County, N. S., a net tonnage of 12,099, and carry 2,500 men. There are 13,000 fishermen engaged in fish buying. These investments represent about \$1,000,000. The sales amounted to \$1,400,000, allowing \$1.50 per quintal. The county of Digby has \$95,380 invested in the fisheries, realizing \$395,334.

St. Louis, Mo., Canadian Minister of Marine and Fisheries, has made a report to the council in favor of permitting American fishermen to come from sea with their vessels to all parts of British Columbia and export their cargo of fish to American markets in bond. This is done at the request of Vancouver people.
