One Ball	For one square rigged vessel.
One Ball, half hoisted,	For two do.
Two Balls close,	For three do.
Two Balls separated,	For four, do.
A Pendant of any colour,	For five, do.
A Pendant under one Ball,	For six, do.
A Pendant over a ball half hoisted,	For seven, do.
A Pendant under two balls close,	For eight do.
A Pendant between two balls separated,	For nine, do.
A Flag of any color	For ten or more.

The above are hoisted at the east or west yard-arm, according to the quarter the vessel first appears in, with the addition of a ball in the centre of the yard, until the vessels can be seen when one or more of the following descriptive colours will be hoisted at the mast head.

- A Union, For a flag ship with or without a squadron.
- Do. with a red pendant over it, for a two-decker.
- Do. with a blue pendant over it, for a frigate.
- Do. with a white pendant over it, for a small armed vessel.
- A red flag, pierced white, for a packet.
- A blue pendant, for a merchant ship.
- A red pendant, for a merchant brig.
- A white pendant, for a topsail sloop or schooner.
- A red flag, for a neutral man of war.
- Do. with a blue pendant under it, for a neutral merchant ship.
- Do. with a red pendant under it, for a neutral merchant brig.
- Do. with a white pendant under it, for a neutral sloop or schooner.

Enemy's Signals.

- A French Jack, for an enemy's fleet.
- A blue pendant under a French pendant, for an enemy's ship.
- A red pendant under a do. for an enemy's brig.

1st. AN Eclipse of the moon on the 26th of the first month (January) in the evening, partly visible. The Moon will rise 4 3-4 digits eclipsed on her south limb at 4h. 41m. End of the Eclipse 6h 2m.

2d. Of the Sun on the 11th of the 2d month (February) at 55 minutes past 6 A. M, invisible.

3d. Of the Moon on the 22d of the 7th month (July) at 11 minutes past 1 in the afternoon, consequently invisible.

4th. Of the Sun on the 5th of the 8th month (August) at 45 minutes after 11 in the morning, invisible here on account of the Moon's great South Latitude.

5th. Of the Sun on the 31st of the 12th month (December) at 57 minutes past 8 in the evening, likewise invisible.

TO KNOW THE AGE OF A HORSE.

EVERY horse has six teeth before in each jaw : till he is two years and a half old they are all smooth and uniform on their upper surfaces. (*See the plate*).

At two years and a half old he sheds the two middle teeth, (by the young teeth's rising and forcing the old ones out, as fig. 1) which at three years old are replaced by hollow ones, as at fig. 7.

When he is about three years and a half old, he sheds two others, one on each side the two middle ones, which at four years old are replaced by two others, which are also hollow, as at fig. 8.

The sharp single teeth (in horses, fig. 2.) begin to

appear in the lower jaw when the horse is about three years and a half or four years old. When he is nearly six years old, they are full grown, pointed, and concave in the inside, as at fig. 3.

When he is four years and a half old, he sheds the two corner teeth, which at five are replaced also with two hollow ones, grooved on the inside, as at fig. 4, which groove marks the age precisely.

At six years of age this groove begins to fill up, and disappear, as at fig. 6, so do the hollows of the rest of the teeth, which continue till near seven and a half or eight years old, when all the teeth become uniformly full and smooth, as at fig. 5.
