DEATH OF LOOK Louis Pasteur Paris, Sept. 30.-Prof. Louis Pasteur celebrated bacteriologist, died at Ga near St. Cloud, at 5.0'clock on Saturday ing. He died from the effects of a pa ing. He died from the effects of a pa

ner St. Cloud, at 5 delock on Saturday even-ing. He died from the effects of a paritytic stock, and had been in a comatose condition several hours before the end. Louis Pasteur was born at Dole, Jura, De-cember 22, 1822, and entered the university in 1840. He became a supernumerary master of studies at the College of Basancon, and was received as a pupil in the Ecole Nor-mate in 1843. In 1847 he took the degree of doctor, and in 1845 was appointed professor of physics at the Faculty of Sciences, Stras-burg, At the end of 1854 he was entrusted as dean with the organization of the newly created faculty of sciences at Lille, and in 1857 returned to Paris, and undertook the scientific direction of the Ecole Normale. In December, 1863, he was appointed professor of geology, physics and chemistry at the Ecole des Essue-Aris, and was elected a mem-ber of the institute. The Royal Society of London in 1856 surveded M. Pasteur the Rum-fond medal for his researches relative to the polarization of Bion on August 12, 1855, was promoted to be an officer of that order in 1868, and became a commander in 1868. He was the author of numerous works relating to hemistry. In 1874 the National Assembly occorded to M.
