THE GREAT HORSE ONTARIO
With the Record of the World in High Jumping—Seven Feet Cleared.

Two Canadian horses, Ontario and Roseberry hold the figures—Ontario's History and Performances.
High jumping, as applied to horses, is of recent growth, but has taken so firm a hold on the public's fancy, that it is now a "drawing" attraction. No authentic record exists in England of any exceptional high jump by a horse with a rider.

In 1909 Jack Spring cleared 5 feet 6 inches three times at the Dublin show, and a tradition exists that Mr. Bicknell in 1792 rode his horse backward and forward over a seven-foot wall which then encompassed Hyde Park, London, the whipper-in to the Earl of Sandwich, and also to have cleared a park fence at Stammer, "nearly 7 feet high." In this country Mr. Fred Coburn's horse, which was the first to make a decided mark as a high jumper, was named "Hampstead," at one time the property of Mr. Henry Wall, and also of Mr. R. B. Roseberry, who was credited with over 6 feet, as was Mr. Raymond Belmont's horse, which cleared 6 feet 4 inches, when he was ridden by a thoroughbred horse called Sharp-catcher, a grandson of Lexington, out of an unknown mare. He was purchased by Mr. S. S. Howland, of Mount Morris, New York, as an untried horse, in the autumn of 1888. Mr. Howland also owned Ontario's sire.
