A NATIONAL CURRENCY.

As an addition to our article of yesterday favoring a national currency instead of the present bank bill it may be urged that owing to the disadvantages that attend our bank notes and the superior advantages of United States notes over them for one thing they are negotiable anywhere for their full value while Canadian bank bills are shamed out of their own province and in the States we are creditors of the Americans just to the extent that we use their bills; or to put it another way, we have sold them so much goods and taken their notes for the amount, which notes are never paid but are constantly renewed without interest. It will not take the Americans long to find this out, and when they do they will just keep printing all the notes Canadians will take. Would it not be more patriotic for us to let our own country enjoy the benefit that arise from a national issue rather than our cute neighbors? When the Monetary Times, the Shareholder and the other financial papers shirk their duty and are yet aware that the circulation of American money in Canada is largely on the increase?
