VALUE OF NEWSPAPERS.


NEWSPAPERS, in the present day of active competition for a livelihood, are as absolutely necessary to a man of business, as hands are to the artisan, or credit to the trader. Without the information they convey, no business can be successfully carried on, for he who attempts to dispense with them, will inevitably find himself deficient in that knowledge which enables his wiser neighbour to pass him in the race.
