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# FAMILY PRAYERS.

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## SUNDAY MORNING.

GRACIOUS Lord of light and life! we desire to remember that thou hast commanded us to keep holy the Sabbath day, have mercy upon us, and incline our hearts to keep this law. We confess that we have often disobeyed it; O forgive us for our Saviour's sake. Let our souls bless and thank thee, that we see the morning light of another of thine own holy days. Grant us grace to resist every temptation to spend any part of it in a vain or useless manner. Grant us grace to consider the use we should make of the time, which thou, our Creator, hast commanded us to keep holy. When we read thy word may we meditate on thy precepts, so that we may be enabled to say, "Thy word have I hid in my heart, that I might not sin against thee." May all the instructions we receive concerning thy word,



be as seed sown in good ground, that shall spring up and bear fruit an hundred-fold. When we are in thy house of prayer, may we feel that we are there to worship, and not to behave in a trifling manner; not to perform a cold and heartless service, but to confess our sins, with sorrow for them; to pray for thy pardoning mercy, and devoutly to praise thee for thy blessed gift of Jesus Christ, thy beloved Son. ## THURSDAY EVENING.

How many who will mourn through the disquietude of their hearts; and are without any sure hope in their God! O Lord grant unto us, if it please thee, refreshing rest; but especially, teach us to put our trust in thee.

May we know in whom we have believed; and may our souls be safe in the hands of that Redeemer to whom we have committed them; and in whose merits alone we desire to trust.

We most humbly address thee in behalf of all those for whom it is our duty to pray.
