The first communication is a letter from Sir John O'Brien, Governor of Newfoundland to Lord Knutsford, Imperial Colonial Secretary, in which the governor gives the minutes of the Newfoundland executive council in favor of the separate arranging with the United States of the fishery and commercial questions as opposed to cooperation with Canada.


