THIRD EDITION. THEATRES BURNED.

THE FIFTH AVENUE AND SEVEN HAVEN THEATRES DESTROYED BY FIRE.

The Fire Started at Midnight, and its Origin is Unknown—The Grand Estates Owned the Buildings—Fanny Davenport Lost all Costumes and Property—Mrs. New Gilsey. The buildings all belonged to the Gilsey estate.

New York, Jan. 3.—The fire that started at midnight last night destroyed the Fifth Avenue Theatre on the corner of Broadway and 38th street, owned by Harry Miner, also Hermann's Theatre adjoining and badly damaged the upper portion of the Starvont house, also dwelling occupied by Mrs. New Gilsey. The buildings all belonged to the Gilsey estate.

The Fifth Avenue was refurbished and decorated by Miner at a cost of \$50,000. This Miner had partially insured but his loss which will be large in consequential damage from the inability to complete his contracts will be great.

Fanny Davenport lost all her costumes and property, the scenery of "Clopestra" costing over \$40,000.

New York, Jan. 3.—A careful estimate of the fire tonight places the loss at \$67,000, about half insured. The damage to Hermann's theatre is about \$25,000. The origin of the fire is still a mystery.
