

An Act to amend the Laws of Upper Canada affecting Trade and Commerce.

WHEREAS it is desirable to amend the Law of Upper Canada Preamble. in certain respects affecting trade and commerce.

Therefore Her Majesty, by and with the consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of Canada, enacts as follows:

5 1. No writ of Fieri Facias or other writ of execution, and no writ of Writ of Executate the description of a debtor, shall prejudice the title to cution not to such goods acquired by any person bona fide and for a valuable consideration, before the actual seizure or attachment thereof by virtue of quired, with such writ; provided such person had not at the time when he acquired out notice before such title, notice that such writ or any other writ, by virtue of which the provided such person had not at the time when he acquired out notice before seizure.

As to costs of 5. The plaintiff shall either by the same, or by a separate writ of execution, be entitled to have made of the defendant's goods the damages, costs and interests in such action or suit.

swer for anperson, being in writing and signed by the party to be charged thereother, need not be in writing.

charge the person by whom such promise has been made, by reason

As to such promises to answer for the debt, default or miscarriage of another made to a firm consisting of two or more persons, or to a single person trading under the name of a firm,—and no promise to answer for the debt, default or miscarriage of a firm consisting of two 15 or more persons, or of a single person trading under the name of a firm, shall be binding on the person making such promise, in respect of anything done or omitted to be done after a change shall have taken place in any one or more of the persons constituting the firm, or in the person trading under the name of the firm, unless the intention of the 20 parties that such promise shall continue to be binding notwithstanding such change, shall appear by express stipulation or by necessary implication from the nature of the firm or otherwise.

Right of Sureties paying the principal or being liable with another for any debt or duty, shall pay such debt 25 debt, &c., to or perform such duty, shall be entitled to have assigned to him or a sasignment.

The principal or perform such duty, shall be entitled to have assigned to him or a trustee for him, every judgment, specialty, or other security which shall be held by the creditor in respect of such debt or duty, whether such judgment, specialty or other security shall or shall not be deemed at law to have been satisfied by the payment of the debt or the perfor-30 mance of the duty.

And such person shall be entitled to stand in the place of the creditor, and to use all the remedies, and if need be, and on proper indemnity, to use the name of the creditor in any action or other proceeding at law or in equity, in order to obtain from the principal debtor 35 or any co-surety, co-contractor or co-debtor, as the case may be, indemnification for the advances made and loss sustained by the person who has so paid such debt or performed such duty; and such payment or performance so made by such surety shall not be pleadable in bar of any such action or other proceeding by him.

what only one co-surety, co-contractor or co-debtor shall be entitled to reone co-security, &c., may recover from any other co-surety, co-contractor or co-debtor, by the
means aforesaid, more than the just proportion to which, as between
those parties themselves, such last mentioned person shall be justly
liable.

Acceptance of 11. No acceptance of any Bill of Exchange, whether inland or Foreign Bills. foreign, made after the day of next, shall be sufficient to charge any person, unless the same be in writing on such Bill, or if there be more than one part of such Bill, on one of the said parts, and signed by the acceptor or by some person duly authorized 50 by him.

12. All actions of account or for not accounting, and suits for such Actions of acaccounts as concern the trade of merchandize between merchant and be commencmerchant, their factors and servants, shall be commenced, and sueded within six within six years after the cause of such actions or suits, or when such years. 5 cause has already arisen, then within six years after the passing of this Act; and no claim in respect of a matter which arose more than six years before the commencement of such action or suit, shall be enforceable by action or suit by reason only of some other matter of claim comprised in the same account, having arisen within six years next 10 before the commencement of such action or suit.

13. No person or persons who shall be entitled to any action or suit Limitation with respect to which the period of limitation within which the same of actions not to be affected shall be brought is fixed by the Imperial Act of the twenty-first year by absence of the reign of King James the first, chapter sixteen, section three, or from U. C., 15 by any Act now in force in Upper Canada, shall be entitled to any &c. time within which to commence and sue such action or suit beyond the period so fixed for the same by the enactments aforesaid, by reason only of such person or some one or more of such persons being at the time of such cause of action or suit accrued without Upper Canada 20 aforesaid, or in the cases in which, by virtue of any of the aforesaid enactments, imprisonment is now a disability, by reason of such person or some one or more of such persons being imprisoned at the time of such cause of action or suit accrued.

16. In reference to the provisions of the Consolidated Statutes for Con. Stat. U. Upper Canada, chapter forty-four, an acknowledgement or promise plained, as to made or contained by or in a writing signed by the agent of the party signatures by chargeable thereby, duly authorized to make such acknowledgement or agents. promise, shall have the same effect as if such writing had been signed 45 by the party himself.

17. This Act shall apply to Upper Canada only.
