EXPLANATION OF THE PRINCIPAL ARTICLES OF THE CALENDAR FOR 1885.

On the left hand page of each month are given the necessary data for Solar observations for Time and Latitude, namely:—The Equation of Time (Sun fast or slow of clock) which is given for the instant of apparent Noon and the Sun's Declination at Mean Noon, both Greenwich Time. Also the Sun's Semi-diameter with these exceptions, all the calculations are reduced to Local Mean Time at Chrlottetown.

If the Sun's Declination at Apparent Noon (Charlottetown) is required it can be obtained by multiplying the hourly variation of Declination by the Equation of Time reduced to the decimal of an hour and adding or subtracting the result according to the conditions as given below.

From the Sun's Semi-diameter which is given for each day throughout the year, may be found the Sun's Horizontal Parallax (which is the earth's apparent Semi-diameter as seen from the Sun's distance) by dividing by 107.44 which is the proportion the Sun's actual diameter bears to that of the earth. Thus for July 1st when the Sun is at his greatest distance we have Semi-diameter $15' 46'' = \frac{990}{107.44} = 8.805$ Horizontal Parallax, so also on December 31st the Sun being in perigee with Semi-diameter $16.18.2 = \frac{978.2}{107.44} = 9.106$ Sun's Horizontal Parallax.

The Parallax in altitude is obtained from the Horizontal Parallax by multiplying by the cosine of the altitude.

Example:—Sun's apparent altitude being $20' 30' 30''$ what correction for Parallax must be applied on the 31st December.

On the Right Hand Page of each month are the changes of the Moon, its Rising, Southing and Setting, with the time of High Water at Charlottetown. The bearing of the Moon at time of change, the times of Perigee and Apogee, of crossing the Equinoctial and reaching its greatest North and South Declination, are given for the purpose of assisting and verifying forecasts of weather. It being generally found that the Lunar Equinoctials are marked by atmospheric disturbances, the greater the more nearly their times agree with the moon's changes or Perigee. $\times \times$ or $\times \times \times$ are added to note where two or three of these influences concur within the space of 48 hours.

ECLIPSES.

During the year there will be four Eclipses, two of the Sun and two of the Moon.

I. An Annular Eclipse of the Sun on March 16th. Greenwich mean time of conjunction 6h. 14m. 23.7 sec.

central line of the Moon's Shadow will pass 200 miles North of Francesia, Hudson's Bay, Davis Straits to East of Greenland.

II. A Partial Eclipse of the Moon March 30th. Greenwich mean time of opposition 4h. 15m. 49.1 sec.

III. A Total Eclipse of the Sun, September 8th. Greenwich mean time of conjunction 9h. 19m. 56.8 sec.

The line of totality will cross Cook's Straits New Zealand, partially visible at sunrise in the east coast of Australia, at sunset at the southern extremity of South America.

IV. A Partial Eclipse of the Moon September 23rd. Greenwich mean time of opposition 19h. 27m. 23.4 sec.

Of these the first and the last will be partially visible at Charlottetown, the phases being as follows:

V. Eclipse of Sun March 16th. First contact of Moon with west part of the margin of the Sun's disc 1h. 28m. p. m. Middle of the Eclipse 2h. 44m. p. m., when about half the Sun's diameter will be covered. End of the Eclipse 3.50 the last contact being at the north east part of the Sun's line.

VI. Lunar Eclipse September 23rd-24th. First contact with Penumbra 46 minutes past midnight. First contact with Shadow September 23rd, 2h. 15m. a. m., middle of Eclipse 3h. 35 sec., a. m., eight-tenth of Diameter obscured, the Moon sets at 5.55 a. m. being still half in Shadow.

PLANETS.

MERCURY.—Mercury will be at his greatest elongation west of the Sun as a morning star rising before the Sun, to the East setting after the Sun at the following dates: West, January 26th, East, April 7th, West, May 25th, East, August 5th, West, September 18th, between which dates his motion will direct and retrograde alternately.

VENUS.—Venus, at the beginning of the year a Morning Star with direct apparent motion till November the 8th, retrograde during the rest of the year, coming to superior conjunction with the Sun May 4th, after which she will reappear as an evening Star till the end of the year. At her greatest apparent distance from the Sun December 8th.

MARS.—Mars, apparent motion direct throughout the year, coming to conjunction with the Sun February 11th, appearing as a Morning Star about the middle of April.

JUPITER.—Jupiter, at the beginning of the year a Morning Star with retrograde apparent motion, in opposition to the Sun February 18th, after which an Evening Star till his conjunction with the Sun September 8th, re-appearing as a Morning Star about the middle of October. From the 22nd April, his motion will be direct till the end of the year.

SATURN.—Saturn, apparent motion direct from February 17th till October 20th, retrograde during the rest of the year, he will be an Evening Star from the beginning of the year till his conjunction with the Sun, June 23rd, after which a Morning Star to the end of the year, in opposition to the Sun and coming to the meridian at midnight, December 25th.

URANUS.—Uranus, motion retrograde from January 5th till June 6th, direct during the remainder of the year, in opposition to the Sun March 20th, in conjunction September 25th, between which dates he will be an Evening Star. The Planet may be found with a telescope at the time of his conjunction with Venus, August 24th, being then about half the Moon's Semi-diameter to the South of Planet.

NEPTUNE.—Neptune, motion direct from January 29th till September 2nd, retrograde during the rest of the year.

2. The phases happening from 4 to 10 p. m. may be followed by fair weather, but this chiefly depends upon the direction of the wind.

3. If a storm arises from the East, on or immediately preceding the Spring Equinox, or a week after, the following Spring or Summer will be wet four times out of five; if from the West, North or South-west, the Spring and Summer will be dry five times out of six.

RATES OF POSTAGE.

RATES OF POSTAGE ON LETTERS WITHIN THE DOMINION OF CANADA, TO NEWFOUND- LAND AND THE UNITED STATES.

and so on, three cents being charged for every $\frac{1}{2}$ oz., or fraction of a $\frac{1}{2}$ oz.

The rate of Postage on a letter posted within the Dominion of Canada, for transmission by Mail to any place in Canada, is three cents per half ounce weight; but the Statute provides that this rate must be prepaid by Postage Stamp at the time of posting the letter.

Any such letter posted wholly *unpaid* or (prepaid less than one full rate of *three cents*) cannot be forwarded to its

destination, but will be sent to the Dead Letter Office, with the reason plainly written or marked upon it—"postage not prepaid."

On letters posted at an office to be delivered from it, commonly known as "*drop letters*," the rate is one cent per $\frac{1}{2}$ oz.; to be in all cases prepaid by postage stamp affixed to such letters when posted.

The charge for the Registration of a letter is 2 cents, to be prepaid by Registration stamp

CANADA AND NEWFOUNDLAND.

Letters for Newfoundland are charged at the rate of *five* cents per half ounce, and must in all cases be *prepaid*.

The Registration fee to Newfoundland is the same as to places within the Dominion, and must in all cases be prepaid by Registration stamp.

CANADA AND THE UNITED STATES.

The rate of postage upon letters passing by mail between Canada and the United States is the same as to places within the Dominion, and must in all cases be prepaid by postage stamp.

The Registration fee to the United States is 5 cents, to be prepaid by Registration stamp.

TRANSIENT NEWSPAPERS AND PERIODICALS ADDRESSED TO PLACES IN CANADA, NEWFOUNDLAND AND UNITED STATES.

On all newspapers and periodicals other than those from the office of publication, including all newspapers and periodicals published less frequently than once a month, the postage rate is one cent per 4 ounces, which must be prepaid by postage stamp.

Newspapers and periodicals weighing less than one oz. may be posted singly; if prepaid by postage stamp, one-half cent each.

Newspapers and periodicals published in the United Kingdom, and re-posted by News Agents to regular subscribers, are not liable to any additional postage.

PARCEL POST.

To any part of the Dominion, for each parcel weighing
 Not more than 4 ozs., 6 cents,
 Exceeding 4 ozs., and not exceeding 8 ozs., 12 cents,
 Each additional 4 ozs. or fraction, 6 cents.

Parcels should not exceed 5 lbs. in weight or 24 inches in length, or 12 inches in breadth, and should be marked "by *Parcel Post*." Parcels may be registered by affixing a 5 cent Registered Letter Stamp thereto, in addition to the postage.

MISCELLANEOUS. POSTAL MATTER,

VIZ., BOOKS AND PAMPHLETS, PRINTED CIRCULARS, PRICES CURRENT, HANDBILLS, ENGRAVERS' BLOCKS, ETC., ETC.

When posted addressed to any place in Canada, and not exceeding 5 lbs. in weight, 24 inches in length, and 12 inches in breadth, or depth, must be prepaid by Postage Stamp at the rate of 1 cent per 4 ounces in weight, and must be put up so as to admit of inspection. Such books, papers, returns, etc., must not be accompanied by any instructions or directions.

Legal and Commercial papers generally are liable to letter rate of Postage.

The rate of postage on Seeds, Cuttings, Bulbs and Roots is 1 cent per 4 ounces, the weight of $\frac{1}{2}$ package not to exceed 24 ounces.

USEFUL HINTS.

Register all valuable letters, and use sealing wax for letters containing money.

Transmit money by Money Orders.

Make complaints and enquiries in writing.

Preserve and request correspondents to preserve envelopes of mis-sent or delayed letters.

Send to the Postmaster envelopes of letters about which you seek information or make complaint.

Business men should be careful to authorize but a limited number of persons to receive their letters, and only those in whom they have full confidence.

A letter or Packet once posted becomes the property of the person to whom addressed, and must be forwarded to its destination. On no application, however urgent, can it be delivered back to the writer. Business men are requested not to ask for the return of Letters posted by mistake or otherwise.

Letters addressed to initials or fictitious names cannot be delivered, but will be returned to the writers through the Dead Letter Office, unless the address contains a designated place of delivery; thus, a letter addressed to A. B., Post Office, Charlottetown, would be returned to the writer, but a letter addressed A. B., care of John Jones, box No. 781, would be delivered at the address designated.

In sending money by mail it is always best to transmit by Money Order, if possible. If sent by letter, it should always be registered.

No single Money Order, payable in the Dominion of Canada, can be issued for more than \$100; but as many of \$100 each may be given as the remitter requires.

Money Orders on the United Kingdom, Newfoundland, the United States, British India, Italy, Germany, Switzerland, Jamaica, New South Wales, Victoria and Tasmania, are drawn in Canada Currency, and may be had for any sum not in excess of \$50; but Postmasters are at liberty to issue several orders of \$50 each, if required by the remitter.

PATTERN AND SAMPLE POST.

CANADA.

Patterns and Samples of Merchandize, not exceeding 24 ounces in weight, when posted in Canada for places within

Canada or Newfoundland, must be prepaid by postage stamp at the rate of *One Cent* per 4 ounces weight, and put up in such a manner as to admit of inspection.

UNITED STATES.

Patterns and Samples of Merchandize, posted for places in the United States, are subject to the special rate of 10 cents each, prepaid by postage stamp, and must not exceed 8 ozs. in weight.

From County Line to Newton, West Newton, Middleton and Somerset, on Tuesday and Friday.

The Supreme Court has both original and appellate jurisdiction—*Original*, as to (1) habeas corpus in criminal and extradition cases; (2) judicial opinions to the Crown; (3) private bills and petitions therefor referred by the Senate or House of Commons; and (4) civil suits in which the validity of a Dominion or Provincial Act is questioned. *Appellate* in appeals (1) from the Exchequer Court; (2) from the Provincial Courts; (3) in habeas corpus cases; and (4) in election cases.

THE EXCHEQUER COURT OF CANADA.

- 11—Pius Flanagan, Georgetown Royalty, that part of Lot 53, being south of Cardigan and north of Brudenell Rivers, including Georgetown Royalty and Common, and Reserved Lands adjoining Royalty.

Extracts from P. E. Island Act to prevent disorderly riding, and to regulate the driving of carriages on the streets and public roads.

SECTION 3. All and every person or persons who shall hereafter drive any sleigh, or any truck, cart or chaise, or wheel carriage whatsoever, within any town, or on any of the highways in this Island, shall drive the same in a moderate and careful manner.

SECTION 4. It shall not be lawful for any person or persons, travelling with empty sleds, to suffer pointed stakes to remain standing, or carry frames or projecting pieces, outside of the said sled.

SECTION 5. Every person who shall ride any horse, or drive any gig, chaise, carriage, waggon, cart, truck, sleigh or sled, on any street in any town within this Island, or on any public road or highway within the same, every such person shall always hereafter in meeting any other horse, gig, chaise, carriage, waggon, cart, truck, sleigh or sled, leave the same on his right hand side in passing.

SECTION 6. Whenever any carriage, waggon, cart, truck, sleigh or sled, shall at any time hereafter stop, or be suffered to stand, loaded or unloaded on any of the said streets or highways, every such carriage, waggon, cart, truck, sleigh or sled shall not be placed nearer to the centre of such street or highway than two feet.

SECTION 7. Specifies a fine for each offence up to ten shillings, besides to the amount of five pound where incurred by breach of the Act.

SECTION 21. In contracts for the sale and delivery of any of the foregoing articles the bushel shall be determined by weighing, unless a bushel by measure be specially agreed upon.

SECTION 18. In using a Dominion measure of capacity the same shall not be heaped, but either shall be stricken with a round stick or roller, straight and of the same diameter from end to end, or if the article sold cannot from its size or shape be conveniently stricken, shall be filled in all parts as nearly to the level of the brim as the size and shape of the article will admit.

Rod, pole or perch shall be five and one half yards.

Chain shall be twenty-two yards.

Link one hundredth part of a chain.

Furlong shall be 220 yards.

Mile 1760 yards.

SECTION 12. The rood of land shall contain one thousand two hundred and ten square yards, according to the Dominion standard yard, and the acre of land shall contain one hundred thousand square links, being four thousand eight hundred and forty such square yards, or one hundred and sixty square rods, poles or perches.

A daily report of the weather is telegraphed from Charlottetown to the head office Toronto. Storm Signals are hoisted at Charlottetown (only) on the approach of storms. They consist of a Cone and Drum hoisted on the mast near the Railway round house, Prince Street.

No. 1. Cone, point downwards, indicates *moderate gale* is expected probably *at first* from an easterly direction.

No. 2. Cone, point upwards, indicates *moderate gale* is expected probably *at first* from a westerly direction.

No. 3. Drum above, Cone below, point downwards, indicates *fresh to heavy gale* is expected probably *at first* from an easterly direction.

No. 4. Cone above, point upwards, Drum below, indicates *fresh to heavy gale* is expected probably *at first* from a westerly direction.

The Cone by itself indicates a probable velocity between 30 and not exceeding 40 miles an hour and it is not intended that an ordinarily well found vessel should stay in port.

The Drum will always be hoisted when the velocity of the velocity of the wind is expected to exceed 40 miles an hour.

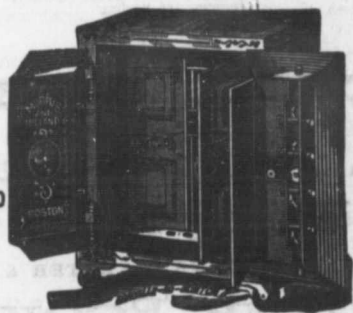

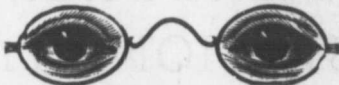
