





Western Bank Fishery A Big Voyage.

Appended is a late report of the Western fishery between Rose Blanche and Hr. LeCou received by the Board o! Trade:-

The catch to date is 8,519 quintals with 2,500 for the last week. Sixtynine dories and skiffs and 37 bankers are fishing. This has been an unprecedented week's fishing, the boats and skiffs operating every day, there being no ice of any kind to contend with, and resulted in the largest catch ever known on this part of the coast. Fully 2,500 qtls. have been secured by the 69 shore dories. The firm of R. Moulton Ltd., took 956 quintals from 17 dories for four days' fishing. All the boats had to remain in two days this week to enable the men to split the catches. The schooners also did well. but not in proportion to the average of the shore dories. Capt. Thornhill, of the schr. "Dorothy Melita," is halling for 1,206 qtls. Captain Vatcher, of the"Reta M. Cluett," has 1,000, and the other schooners that have been here ome time are also well fished. There have been 7 more arrivals this week, and news of the big catches is making the fleet on the alert.







Newfoundland Agricultural Board.

BULLETIN No. 2.

To District Agricultural Societies:

The Agricultural Board has ascertained that there are considerable stocks of potatoes held in the country over and above what will be required as seed for the coming season's crop. The Agricultural Board, however, thinks it desirable to warn Societies and individuals against the inducement that prevailing high prices will offer, and which might possibly conduce to the selling for food purposes of a portion of the quantities that could with much greater advantage be kept for

Present indications point to the continuance of high prices for another year or longer, and therefore those holding stocks of potatoes can certainly derive a larger measure of profit therefrom by planting more largely than usual, and selling the product, than by selling all their potatoes for food purposes only, now or later in the season.

Your own interests and the Country's can best be conserved by each holder of potatoes first providing amply for his own seeding requirements and next by selling to others requiring seed, before disposing of any for consumption.
