Until it happened one fine day The two of 'em just slipped away An' straight into the parson went, Which ended all the argument.

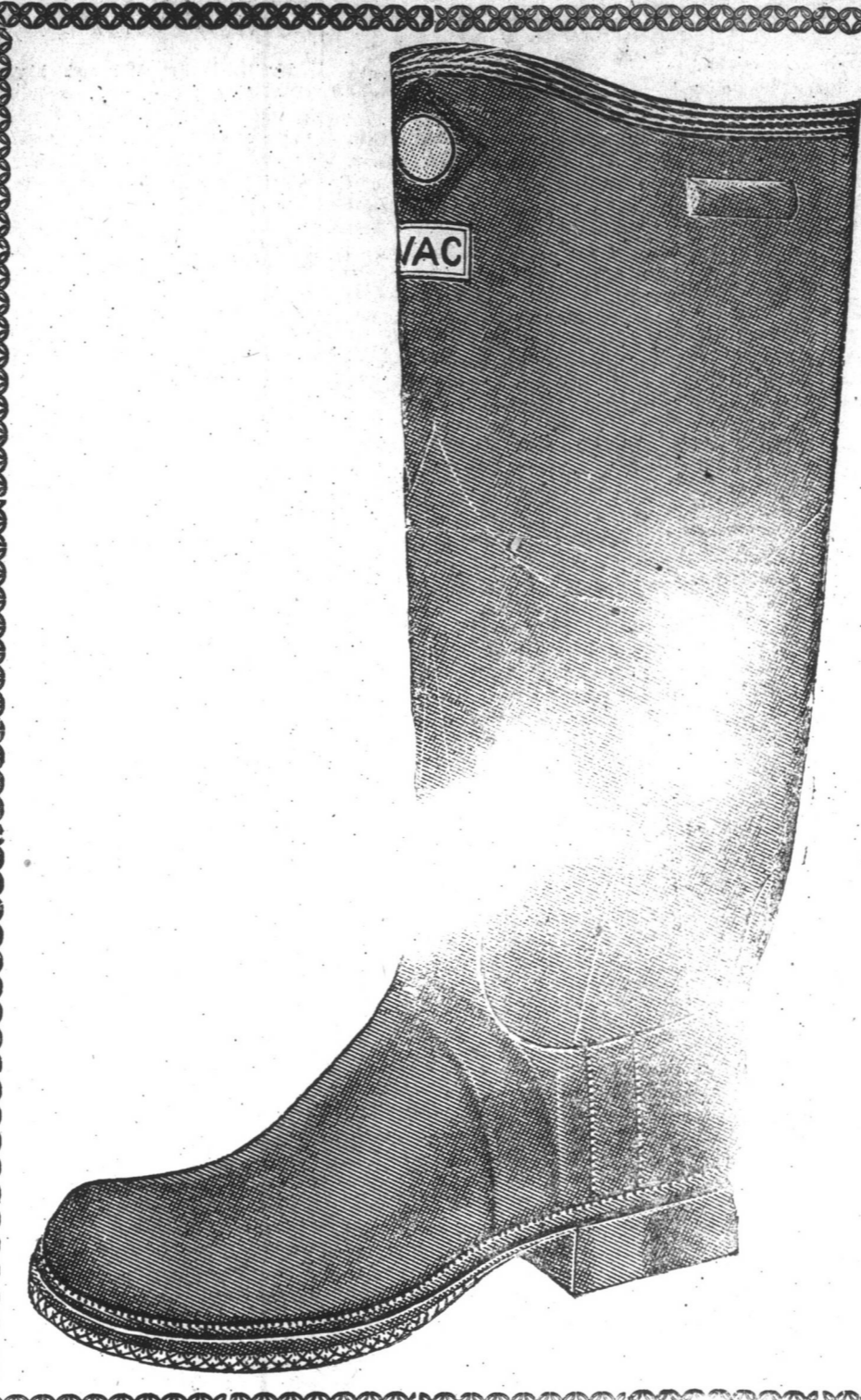

Naval Commander's Bravery in the War.

"The bravest deed of the year" in 1917 for which the Stanhope medal was awarded was thus described: "About 3 p.m. on February 8, 1917, one of H.M. ships struck a mine about four miles off Dungeness, and sank in a few minutes. With the intention of picking up survivors a trawler steamed over the spot and in putting off her boat it was damaged and broke adrift. Shortly afterwards Commander F. H. L. Lewin, R.N., drifted alongside with two men clinging to him, and although he knew he might drift away again any moment as others had already done, he called out to those on the trawler to take the men first, he supporting the second man until the first was dragged on board. Eventually all three were rescued in a state of complete exhaustion, having been in the water thirty minutes. There was a heavy sea, running, the weather was very cold, and the deck of the trawler covered with ice. For this gallant action Commander Lewin received the Stanhope medal at the annual meeting of the Royal Humane Society in February, 1918.

DEBATES IN PARLIAMENT

Feb. 18.—The marriage bill was read the third time and passed.

On the same day, a motion was ordered for the adjournment of the House in the room of Sir John Anstruther, P. M.

Mr. Knight, Esq., Chairman of the Committee on the Warwick election declared the sitting to have been duly elected.

The commencement of the year, and the address of the House, was read, upon a subject which has been discussed in another part of this issue.

It was not for the honour of Britain to make war on any interference in her affairs, or for the establishment of any particular form of government in that country.

It is the duty of his Majesty's Ministers to advise his Majesty in any treaty which might retard or prevent his Majesty from making peace with France.

Mr. Fox was the first man that spoke in the House, at a moment when the country was involved in a war which he had promised his Majesty, and which he had argued as

an arduous and dangerous war, come forward to suggest the taking of measures to involve the country in an additional war. Poland, which was now advanced to our view, as an object for which we were to enter into hostilities against Prussia and Russia, had never before been considered of equal importance with Holland to this country.

The policy of Great Britain had led her for centuries to look to every aggrandizement of France as of far greater importance, and of greater danger, than the aggrandizement of any other country, and for a substantial reason; France was a formidable power, and near us. The same danger could not arise from Russia or Prussia, nor being powers at a considerable distance.

Mr. Fox contended that the balance of Europe was as much endangered by the aggression against Poland as by the aggrandizement of France, and concluded by agreeing to the motions, which appeared to him to contain principles incontestible.

Mr. Jenkinson contended that it means honourable to this country had been omitted to obtain peace; he insisted that France had compelled us to war by her aggrandizements, which were not notorious and which, if permitted by this country, must have been ruinous to every interest of Great Britain.

Mr. Fox's proposition for sending an ambassador to France, for, in France, there existed no power to treat with—all was provisional, and might have but the existence of a moment.
