

THE WORLD AT LARGE

The New York Morning Journal has a circulation of 90,000 gained in one year. It is the brightest paper in America, not even excepting the Toronto World.

A small package which arrived from Amsterdam last night was seized at the postoffice, New York, yesterday. It contained diamonds valued at \$20,000.
