ONE CENT. FASTEST MILE EVER MADE.

READING TRAIN SPEEDS AT A RATE OF 90 MILES AN HOUR.

A Mile Traveled With an Engine and Three Cars in 39 4-5 Seconds. The World's Record Broken by President McLeod.

PHILADELPHIA, Aug. 30.—A mile in 39 4-5 seconds, or at the rate of over 90 miles per hour, is the fastest run ever made by a railroad train.

At 1 p.m. a train consisting of an engine and three cars rolled out of the station at Ninth and Green-streets. The engine was No. 205 of the Woodson pattern.

The train drawn by this engine comprised two ordinary day coaches, No. 658 and 208, and two Pullman day coaches.
