The noise of the hammering awoke the child, frightened by the sight of so much blood she began to scream till the neighbor rushed in. The engraver was still breathing and was taken to the St. Louis Hospital, but it is not expected that he can recover.

THE GREAT STALLION'S RECORD AT FLEETWOOD
