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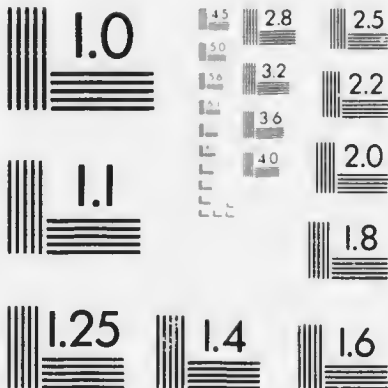

RULES AND REGULATIONS

The American and B. C. Poultry Association Rules govern this Show, which will be by comparison.

Entries close Thursday, December 5th, and must be in the hands of the Secretary by that date.

Local exhibits must be in Show Rooms by 9 p.m. on Tuesday, December 10th.

Outside exhibits will be taken care of from the time they arrive at Express Office and returned to same.

Exhibits may be sent to the Secretary by parties not wishing to attend the Show

Committee will not be responsible for any damage done to exhibits in transit or while in their care.

All birds must be entered singly as cock, hen, cockerel or pullet, or as a pen.

RULES AND REGULATIONS (*Continued*)

Birds entered singly may compete in pens, if they are declared and additional fee is paid.

Pens to consist of one male and three females.

All exhibits must be leg-banded and numbers sent to the Secretary with entry, otherwise band will be put on and charged for.

All exhibits must be the property of the exhibitor at the time of exhibition.

No cards or ribbons other than those won at this Show will be allowed on coops before judging.

Advertising matter may be displayed after the cards are placed.

Holders of Membership Tickets to be admitted free, non-members charged 25 cents.

Exhibits entered in regular classes will be considered as competing for specials without additional entry.

Entry fee, 25c.; Pens, \$1.00. Prizes will be awarded all recognized varieties as follows:—

PREMIUMS

Under five entries—1st, \$1.00; 2nd, 50c; 3rd, 25c.

Five and under ten—1st, \$1.50; 2nd, \$1.00; 3rd, 50c.

Ten and over—1st, \$2.00; 2nd, \$1.50; 3rd, \$1.00

Exhibition Pen (1 male and 3 females)—1st, \$3.00; 2nd, \$2.00; 3rd, \$1.00.

No Pen prizes awarded to ducks, turkeys and geese. Bantams and pigeons given awards for best display only. Prizes—1st, \$2.00; 2nd, \$1.00; 3rd, 50c.

Utility Pens, (1 male and 4 females of one purebred variety), Entry fee, \$1.00. Prizes—1st, \$4.00; 2nd, \$3.00; 3rd, \$2.00; both weight and non-weight classes.

Special Prize of \$2.00 for best cock in all varieties.

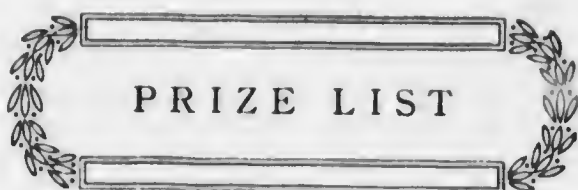

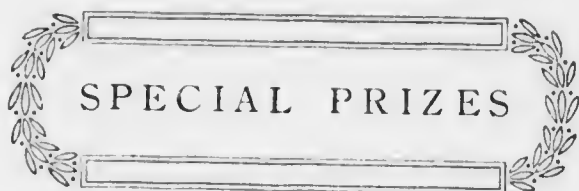
