PROHIBITIONISTS WORKING UP SUCCESSFUL LABOR LEADER

Scent of Coming Dominion Elections Has Reached Them and They Are Working.

ARE SORE ON THE GOVERNMENT.

The Executive Committee of the Council of the Dominion Alliance has issued a circular to prohibitionists, in view of the forthcoming elections, to the Government's action in regard to the prohibition question. In part the circular is as follows: "The Alliance Executive calls attention to the fact that the Government and Parliament have united to sustain the liquor traffic, in defiance of the people's wishes, and in violation of what the public had accepted as an agreement that the traffic was to be outlawed if the people voted against it in an effort to make such changes in their representation in the House of Commons as will assure the embodiment in law of the policy which has been endorsed at the polls.
