

PETERBOROUGH.

The County Town of the County of Peterborough, is situated at the north-east corner of the Township of Monaghan.

It was first located in the year 1818, and the survey was completed in 1825, so that it yet lacks a few years of being half a century of age.

It is pleasantly situated, the ground on which it is built sloping gently from the west, towards the Otonabee River, a rapid and beautiful stream, which separates the town from the village of Ashburnham on its opposite bank.

The general appearance of Peterborough compares very favourably with that of any town in the province, and commercially speaking it presents an aspect of thrift and enterprise, which speaks in the highest terms for the business prosperity of the place.

Within the last few years a large number of handsome stores have been erected on George, and the other principal business streets, and the rapidity with which these have found tenants, is a sure indication of the healthy state of the commercial affairs of the town.

Many of the stocks in the various dry goods, grocery, hardware and book stores, &c., are exceedingly large, varied, and well selected, and are offered at prices which are as favourable to purchasers as it is possible to make them.

Peterborough is favoured in the possession of one of the best water powers in the Province—that supplied by the Otonabee River. From the town up the river for a distance of nine or ten miles this stream has a fall of about 280 feet, furnishing upwards of eighty-four thousand horse power. This immense water power has been made available to a considerable extent, but in consequence of its extensive character it is still capable of great extension.

Peterborough undoubtedly possesses all the requisite qualifications required for the making of an important manufacturing

town. The almost exhaustless power supplied by the previously mentioned river, together with the very extensive timber districts in its rear, offer facilities for manufacturing which are certainly equal to those possessed by any other community in the Province. By means of Railway communication the town is connected with all parts of Canada, and the neighbouring States. It is distant from Lindsay, 28 miles; Cobourg, 30 miles; Port Hope, 30 miles; Toronto, 90 miles; Hamilton, 127 miles; Kingston, 133 miles; London, 204 miles; Ottawa, 228 miles; Montreal, 297 miles; Quebec, 477 miles; Portland, 589 miles; Boston, 631 miles; and New York 697 miles. In 1852 the population of Peterborough was only 1,800. In 1858, it had increased to 3,500, and at the present time it is about 5,000.

## LINDSAY.

---

The County Town of the County of Victoria is situated in the Township of Emily, near the centre of the County, and is built on both banks of the River Scugog. A few years ago Lindsay sustained a serious injury in consequence of a very devastating fire destroying the greater part of the business portion of the town. Although this event occurred but three or four years ago, scarcely any traces of it are now visible; while it was undoubtedly a serious calamity at the time, the results arising from it were of such a nature as to materially improve the appearance of the place, for the class of buildings that were built after it had taken place, were altogether superior to those which were in existence previous to its occurrence.

Lindsay is situated in the midst of one of the richest arable counties in Canada. Its local trade is excellent, and as the surrounding country possesses great agricultural advantages, it is not likely to decline, but on the contrary to increase yearly, as the various townships become more thickly settled, and also on account of its very central position rendering it easy of access from all parts of the country. It possesses a good water privilege, and is connected by rail with all parts of Canada. Lindsay is distant from Peterborough 28 miles; Port Hope 40 miles; Coburg 47 miles; Toronto 100 miles; Hamilton 137 miles; Kingston 143 miles; London 214 miles; Ottawa 238 miles; Montreal 307 miles; and Quebec 487 miles. Its population is about 2,000.



TERMS OF THE COURTS.

UPPER CANADA.

APPEAL TERMS commence on the fourth Thursday next after Hilary, Easter and Michaelmas Terms.

LAW TERMS.—Hilary begins first Monday in February, and ends Saturday of the ensuing week; Easter begins 3rd Monday in May, and ends Saturday of the ensuing week; Trinity begins Monday next after 21st August, and ends on the Saturday of the ensuing week; Michaelmas begins third Monday in November and ends Saturday of the ensuing week. Long vacation from 1st July to 21st August.

CHANCERY TERMS.—*Examination Terms*—From 1st Tuesday of February to the Saturday after 2nd Tuesday of April; and from 1st Tuesday of September to the Saturday after 1st Tuesday of November. *Hearing Terms*—From 4th Monday in April until Saturday of the following week; and from 3rd Monday in November until Saturday of the following week. the reports of the Master or Deputy Masters. Long vacation from the 1st July to 21st August.

COUNTY COURT TERMS commence on the first Monday in Jan., April, July and Oct., and end the following Saturday.


