## ST. ANDREW'S CHURCH, LONDON,

FOR THE YEAR 1871.

YOUR Committee, in presenting this our Twenty-first Annual Report, would desire to acknowledge the goodness of the Almighty towards the Congregation during the year now past, for the large measure of prosperity enjoyed by the community generally, and for the harmony and good feeling which has existed in the Congregation, and that God in His mercy has restored the health of our beloved Pastor, so that very little ministerial assistance has been required during the year. Your Committee are well aware that his duties are more arduous than any one person can accomplish, considering the large number of the Congregation and the distance to their several residences.

Your Committee, in compliance with a resolution passed at a previous Annual Meeting of the Congregation, have erected a new Manse with summer and winter kitchens, wood sheds, &c., and supplied with soft and hard water.— They have also erected fences around the building, and as it is now almost ready, they hope our beloved Pastor will be able in a few weeks to occupy the same, thus allowing the old Manse to be removed and the west door of the church opened for the accommodation of the Congregation. The amount so far expended on the erection of the Manse is \$2942.37, leaving the sum of about \$900 still due to the contractors, which appears in the abstract of liabilities and assets annexed to this Report.

In regard to the financial position of the Congregation, your Committee have to report that the ordinary revenue for the past year was \$3683.14, and has exceeded the expenditure by the amount of \$763.50, which has been applied towards the erection of the new Manse, which, when completed, will make the floating debt of the Church (exclusive of the mortgage debt of \$9000) \$1293.27. This amount your Committee recommend should be liquidated by a subscription list being opened at this annual meeting, and they have no doubt that a much larger sum than that required would be subscribed.

Your Committee are pleased to observe that the annual income has increased (except the pew ronts,) but are sorry to observe that arrears to the amount of \$594.79 were due on the 1st January, 1872. They hope that those in arrears will pay the same immediately, as they are informed by the Treasurer that it is not the poor of the Congregation who are in arrears, but those who are well able to pay.

The books of the Treasurer, Mr. Wm. Begg, together with the books of the Treasurer of the building fund and pew rents, have been duly examined by the auditors and found correct ; abstracts of these accounts are annexed to There is also annexed hereto a statement of this Report. all the money expended from the commencement of the new Church up to 1st January, 1872, from which it appears that during that period the Congregation has expended on Church, new Manse and improvements, the sum of \$30,774.45, of which sum \$9000 was borrowed from the Huron & Erie Savings and Loan Society, and \$1500 from the Canadian Bank of Commerce, showing that during that period the sum of \$20,274.45 has been paid by the Congregation towards the new buildings and improvements, and your Committee are assured that if the subscription list referred to be opened, that the sum of at least \$2000 will be subscribed, and thus relieve the Congregation of all liabilities, except the \$9000 loan from the Huron & Erie Savings and Loan Society.

Your Committee would, as in last year's Report, point out the necessity there is for the prompt and regular payment of the pew rents. They think it is extremely unsatisfactory that in such a Congregation there should be arrears to the amount of \$594.79 due at the end of the year, and that upwards of \$900 should still be unpaid on the Church building fund subscription list.

Your Committee would also recommend that the quarterly collections for meeting the interest on the Mortgage debt be still continued during the current year. Considerable inconvenience has been experienced by having the ordinary revenue and building fund accounts kept separately, and your Committee recommend that the office of Treasurer be, if possible, filled by one person.

In compliance with the rules of the Congregation six managers retire annually. Those whose term of office now expires are :
