THE NEW U. S. TARIFF.
The McKinley tariff bill has passed the House of Representatives and there is no doubt that it will become law, probably on the 1st of July next. We publish elsewhere on the page the rates of duty which will in future be levied on various articles produced in Canada. This list of course, does not include all Canadian products that are exported to the United States, but it embraces the most important of them, and a reference to it will enable our readers to see how very
seriously the new tariff will affect our trade with the United States.
To begin with grain, take the article of barley for instance. Last year 934,501 bushels of barley were exported from Canada to the United States. The duty on this article under the old Ameri-
can tariff was ten cents a bushel. This duty by the McKinley tariff bill has been increased to 30 cents a bushel, so that it is probable that the barley export to the United States will be entirely wiped out.
The people of the province of Ontario, who are the largest exporters of barley, will find it necessary to send their pro- ducts to England, where it is not unlike-
ly they will find quite as good a market for it as they have done in the United States. Potatoes is another article which we send in large quantities to the United States. Last year we
exported 717,668 bushels of potatoes to that country, but sometimes the export is much larger, it being regulated to a considerable extent by the state of the
crop in New England. The U. S. duty on potatoes until now has been 15 cents a bushel, but the new tariff will increase it to 20 cents a bushel. We have also exported agreat deal of hay
to the United States. Last year 82,308 tons went to that country and paid duty at the rate of \$2 a ton; under the new tariff \$4 a ton is charged on hay.
Our export of eggs last year amounted to 14,111,017 dozen, valued at \$1,156,625. These eggs all went in free of duty, but after this they will have to pay an impost of 5 cents a dozen. This will proba-
bly put an end to the export of eggs to the United States. We also export large number of animals to that country every year. Last year we sent there 17,277 horses, valued at \$2,113,782. These
horses, valued at \$2,113,782. These horses paid a duty of 20 per cent. ad valorem. The duty is now increased to a specific one of \$30 a head, but where a horse is valued at \$150, or over the duty,
is 30 per cent ad valorem. Thus it will be seen that the duty on horses has been increased by more than 50 per cent. Our export of horned cattle to the U.S. is quite large, the number sent to
 that country last year being 37,360. They were valued at \$488,266 and paid duty at the rate of 20 per cent. The new tariff places an impost of \$2 a head on
cattle less than a year old, and \$10 a head on animals exceeding one year. The greatest increase of duty is, however with respect to sheep, of which we ex-
ported to the United States last year 307, 775, valued at \$918,334. The duty at the rate of 20 per cent on these sheep
would be \$183,666, but the new tariff imposes a duty of \$1.50 a head so that the same number of sheep under it would pay \$461,
662. We send some butter and cheese to the United States, which here-tofore have been admitted on payment of a duty of 4 cents a pound. Under the
new tariff both butter and cheese will pay 6 cents a pound. Vegetables in their natural state have heretofore paid 10 per cent ad valorem; now the duty is increas- ed to 25 per cent. Straw, which has until
now gone in free of duty will hereafter be subject to an impost of \$2 a ton. The new tariff imposes a duty on all fish fresh satted, pickled and smoked
or preserved, not specially enumer ated, of one cent a pound. Here- tofore fresh fish for immediate con- sumption has entered free of duty. The
duty on pickled or salted herring is re tained at ½ a cent a pound. This impost of a duty on fresh fish for immediate consumption has long been threatened
and now that it has come it will probably result in making some important changes in the fish trade. On beef and pork the duty has been doubled, being increases from one cent a pound to two cents. The
duty on bacon and hams under the old tariff was two cents a pound, and this has been increased to five cents. The duties on wood will be found fully stated
in the list which we publish elsewhere and therefore do not require any partic- ular comment here. Such changes as are made however are in direction of higher duties.


