AN EXPLANATION FROM AUSTRALIA

REGARDING THE NEW CUSTOMS REGULATION
Inland Freight Charges Are Added Only on Articles on the Ad Valorem List

Ottawa, Oct. 19.—The comptroller-general of Australia has written to the Canadian government that the Australian customs regulation adding the inland freight to the value for customs purposes applies only to articles on the Australian ad valorem list.

It is recalled from this that the business of the Australian-Canadian line will not be seriously affected.

The annual report of the post office department for the year ending March 30th last shows a surplus of \$400,844. This includes the service for the Yukon and Athlita. If the Yukon and Athlita be left out the surplus is \$502,785. The revenue for Athlita and the Yukon was \$101,940 less than the expenditure.

POLICE HAVE CLUE TO THE ROBBERY

CHIEF THINKS HE HAS COLPRIT IDENTIFIED
Promises Revelations Within Twenty Four Hours—Interview With the Proprietor of Rifled Store

The robbery of C. E. Redfern's jewelry store, in which nearly \$5,000 worth of diamonds, rings and other valuable jewelry was stolen, gives promise of being cleared up within the next twenty-four hours.

Very important clues have been discovered, and are now being traced down by Chief of Police Langley and his force of detectives, who have been working continuously on the case since the robbery was committed.

It is said that the persons who committed the robbery are known, and that all that remains to be done is to locate the whereabouts of the guilty parties.

Chief Langley was seen this morning, and said: "Yes, we have a clue, and an important one. I do not care to state positively at this time whom we suspect, as it would tend to upset our plans."

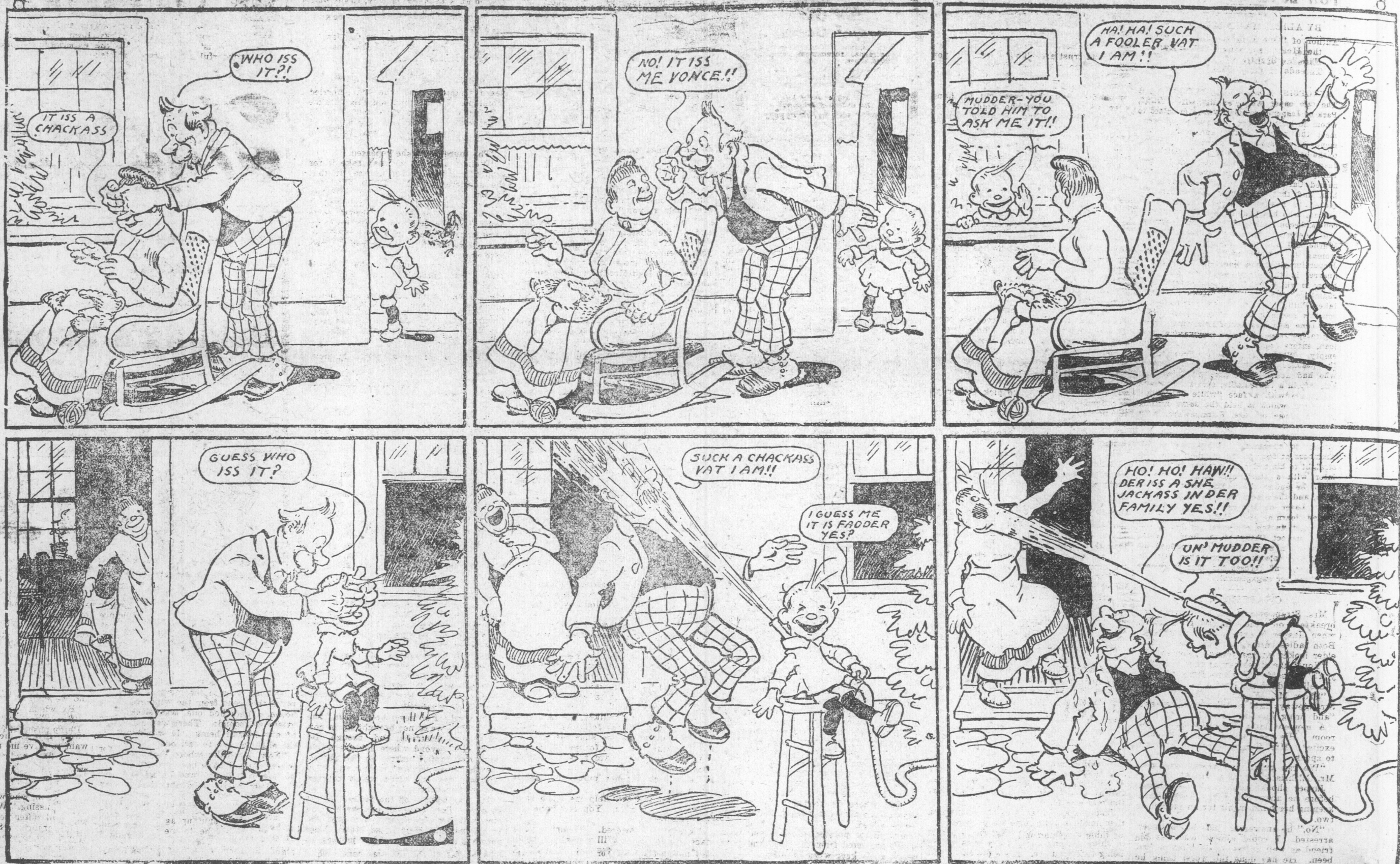

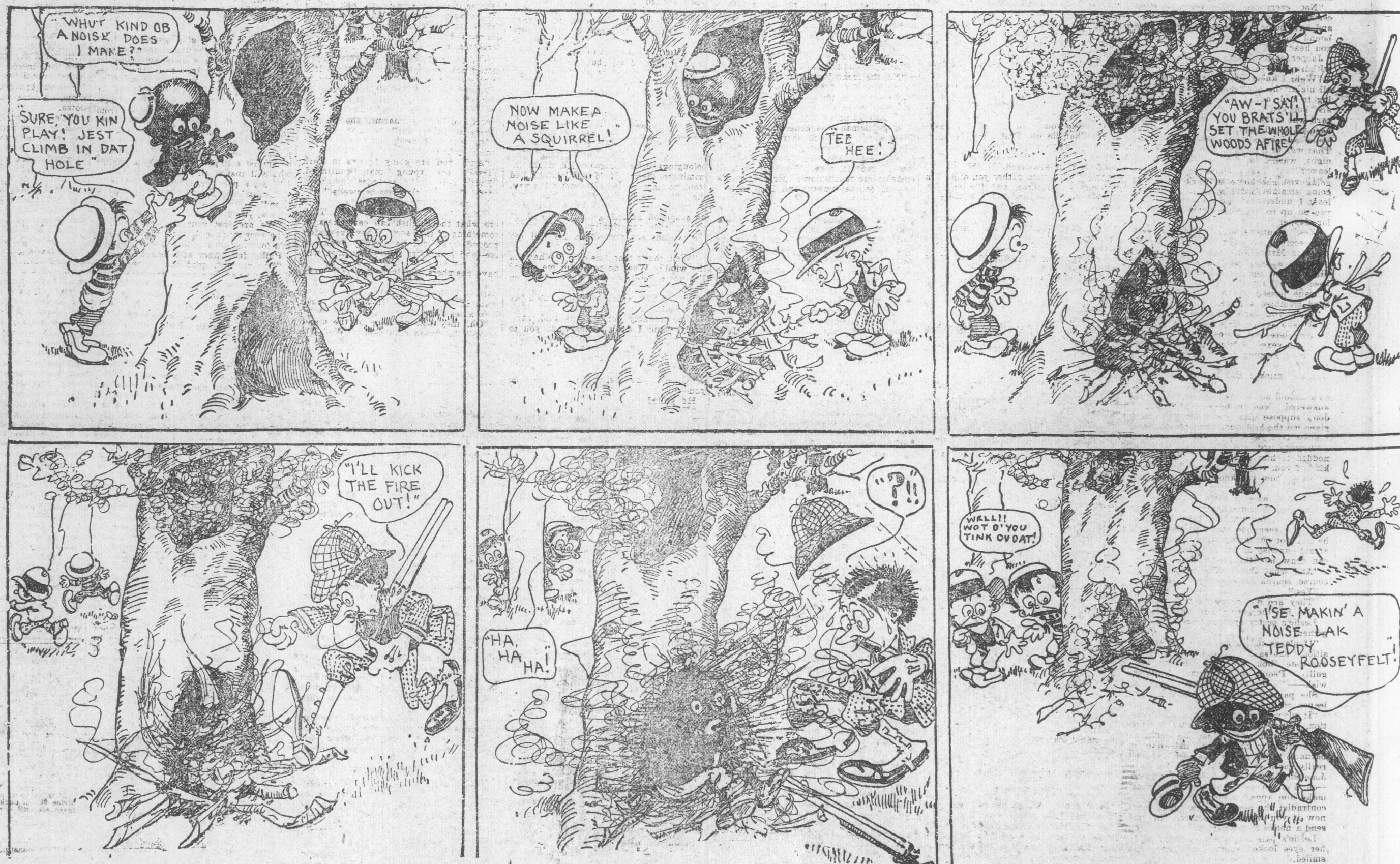

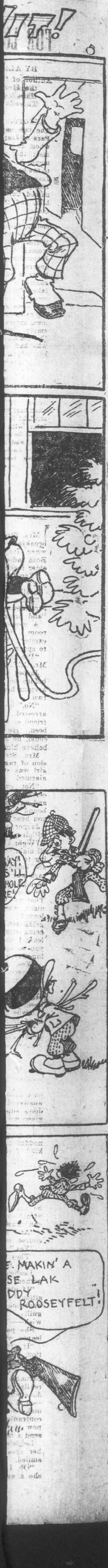
