MALT FACTORY.—The manufacture of malt is carried on to a large extent by Thomas Peck, Esq. Orders are filled for Sarnia, Windsor, Hamilton, Toronto, Suspension Bridge, and other places. The malt house is one of the largest stone buildings in town.

TANNERIES.—There are three tanneries, run by Wagner & Co., Young & Biggar, and W. Burnett. They give employment to a large number of workmen, and do a rushing and remunerative business.
