## TOWN OF GALT.

The town of Galt is beautifully situated on the banks of the Grand River, in the midst of a rich agricultural district. **BAKERS.**—Jas. Neilson, West Main, J. & W. Miller, North Water street; J. J. England, Main street; C. W. Wilcox, Dickson—all manufacturing a first-class article and doing a thriving business.

**G. A. MURRAY** is a manufacturer of harness and collars, whips, lashes, and all others articles in the harness line. His shop is on North Water street. Mr. Meikle, and Messrs. Quarrie & Saunders are also in the harness business on Main street.

**JAMES PATTERSON** runs the Waterloo Sash, Door, and Blind Factory, on Ainslie st. He contracts for all kinds of buildings and has every facility for turning out first-class work with despatch, on reasonable terms.

**DUMFRIES FOUNDRY**, of Goldie and McCulloch, employ from 160 to 200 hands in making steam engines, mill gearing of all kinds, woolen mill machinery, wood-working machinery, burr mill stones, fire-proof safes, etc.

**MALT FACTORY.**—The manufacture of malt is carried on to a large extent by Thomas Peck, Esq. Orders are filled for Sarnia, Windsor, Hamilton, Toronto, Suspension Bridge, and other places. The malt house is one of the largest stone buildings in town.

**TANNERIES.**—There are three tanneries, run by Wagner & Co., Young & Biggar, and W. Burnett. They give employment to a large number of workmen, and do a rushing and remunerative business.

**THE DICKSON MILLS.**—These excellent mills were built in 1843, and are now carried on by Richard Blain, Esq. The main building is stone 75 x 45 feet and four stories high. The reputation of the Dickson Mills is A 1 at home, and abroad its flour commands the highest prices.

**GALT AXE, EDGE TOOL AND SPRING WORKS.**—This establishment consists of a forge, grinding shop, finishing shop, and carpenter shop. It is now carried on by Warnock & Co. A large number of men are employed, and the axes, edge tools and springs turned out have a provincial reputation.

**GALT FOUNDRY.**—This foundry is carried on by Cowan & Co., and has been in operation about twenty-five years. The firm principally direct their attention to the manufacture of engines of all kinds, boilers, wood-working, and general machinery. They employ a large number of hands, and their business extends over a large extent of country.
