KING EDWARD VII HAS PASSED AWAY.

THROUGH HEARS PROCLAMATION

George V. Proclaimed King at St. James' Palace--Brilliant Ceremony Witnessed by Thousands.

ROYAL SALUTE.

LONDON, May 9.—With the time-honored ceremony of a most brilliant and impressive character, George V. this morning was publicly proclaimed King of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the seas, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India.

Stately at the stroke of nine, four heralds arrayed in medieval uniform of a scarlet, heavily braided with gold, mounted the balcony of Priars Court at St. James Palace, where Queen Victoria presented herself to the people upon the opening of her memorable reign and blew a fanfare through their long silver trumpets.

DEATH CAME SUDDENLY FRIDAY EVENING AT 8.45.

News Came as a Great Shock to Nation and Whole Civilized World. Empire in Mourning.

NEW KING GEORGE V.

LONDON, May 9.—King Edward VII, who returned to England from a vacation ten days ago in the best of health, died at 11.45 o'clock tonight in the presence of his family, of illness hardly more than three days. The Prince of Wales succeeded to the throne, according to the laws of the Kingdom. His first official act was to despatch to the Lord Mayor the announcement of his late father's death in pursuance of custom. His telegram read: "I am grieved to inform you that my father, the King, passed away at 11.45 (Signed) George."

The physicians afterwards issued their official bulletin, which was as follows: "11.45 p. m. His Majesty, the King, breathed his last at 11.45, in the presence of Her Majesty, Queen Alexandra, the Prince and Princess of Wales, Princess Royal, the Duchess of Fife, Princess Victoria and Princess Louise, the Duchess of Argyll.

MEMORIAL SESSION OF TOWN COUNCIL

Resolutions Touching the Death of King Edward VII and Ascension of George V Passed.

NATIONAL ANTHEM

A special memorial session of the Town Council was held last evening for the purpose of introducing resolutions relative to the death of our beloved sovereign King Edward VII and the accession to the throne of his successor King George V, and on motion of the Council, these resolutions were made the sole order of the day at that meeting.

A picture of the late King, in Windsor uniform, draped in royal mourning, hangs on the wall over the Mayor's chair in the Council Chamber, while the Canadian flag flies at half mast over the building.

BEAUTIFUL TRIBUTE BY SALVATION ARMY Queen Mother Allows Its Band to Enter Palace Grounds. HOLDS A SERVICE

LONDON, May 9.—An impressive incident on Sunday illustrated Queen Alexandra's desire to show consideration for British subjects of every class. General Booth sent a message that the Salvation Army wished to show honor to King Edward VII by holding a special service before the palace and Queen Alexandra gave permission. At four o'clock a large band, wearing red jerseys and carrying silver instruments and banners with scarves of crepe, pushed their way through the crowd to the palace. The big iron gates were opened and the band formed a circle under the windows. First they knelt while the leader prayed, and then they sang, "Near My God to Thee, Abide With Me, and Angels Ever Bright and Fair. They finally marched out singing "Ours Christian Soldiers. The blinds were closed, but the attendance was Queen Alexandra left her apartments with Princess Mary and her ladies in waiting and listened to the singing from behind them.

stream of callers passed through the diplomatic entrance to sign the victor's book and make inquiries. The more intimate friends of the royal family were received at the entrance to the wing of the palace, where the King's apartments are situated. The crowd outside was an ever changing one, the early ones being artisans who stopped on their way from work. Later all classes commenced to flock toward Green and St. James Park toward the palace. When the morning bulletin, which long before had been given to the press and circulated in special additions was posted on the fence, the square was crowded so that police reserves had to be called to make a traffic for the morning traffic. Showers which were accompanied by a sharp wind, only drove a few away and it looked as though Palace Square would be filled the night long until the police moved those who had been informed that no further bulletins were forthcoming. Only groups and groups remained to look on.

WASHINGTON, May 6.—President Taft on learning of the death of King Edward VII, the following message of condolence to Her Majesty, Queen Alexandra, which was called to Buckingham Palace tonight: "On the sad occasion of the death of King Edward, I offer to your Majesty and to your son, his illustrious successor, the most profound sympathy of the president of the people and the government of the United States. Whose hearts go out to you in your great loss. To this I add the expression to your Majesty and the new King and of my appreciation of those high qualities which made the life of the late King so potent an influence toward peace and justice among the nations."

LONDON, May 7.—Only the nearest relatives and doctors were with the King at the end. The cause of death, it is understood, was pneumonia, following bronchitis. Portland, Me., May 6.—Every Repealer will be shocked and grieved at the loss of His Majesty's exclamation, "God bless him," which was uttered tonight, when informed of the death of the King. The shock is more keen because it was not realized in barracks, on the march, in the field or elsewhere in the known world where two or more Britters were together. The King, God bless him, words not uttered in form or meaningless custom but everyone gave this loyal toast and repeated these words of love and fealty with a fervor and a full heart's measure of affection and veneration for one whom we all loved and respected.

State Funeral on Friday, May 20.

London, May 9.—The proclamation announcing the accession of King George V. was read at St. James Palace this morning. Friday, May 20th, has been definitely fixed as the date for King Edward's Funeral.

TEN KILLED IN AN EXPLOSION AT HULL

OTTAWA, May 8.—By the explosion of four tons of wire, an explosive even stronger than dynamite, in the factory of the General Explosive Co., situated in the northwest end of Hull, Que. at 8:45 last evening, at least ten people were killed, a score seriously injured, and the whole cities of Hull and Ottawa, across the river, were shaken by a terrifying shock, which shattered plate glass windows through out the city and for a few moments caused almost a panic in both cities, citizens thinking that an appalling earthquake catastrophe had taken place.


