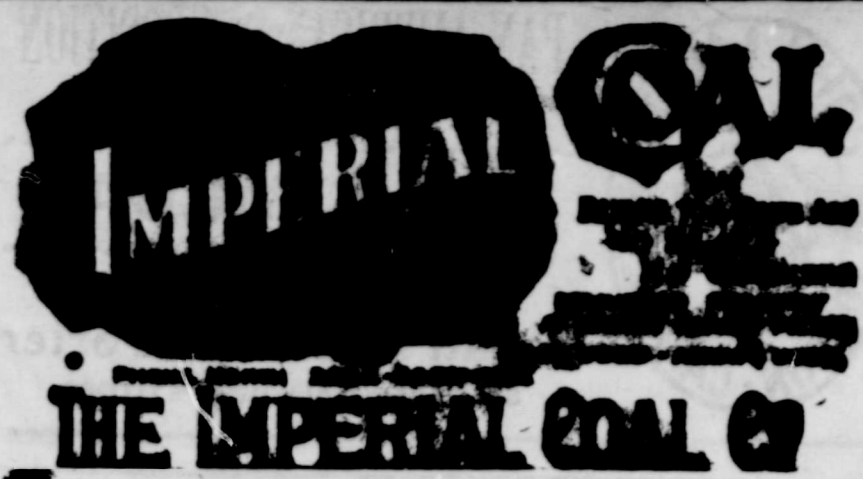
In Port Colborne A. D. Cross and D. Roach, Liberals, were cut off, and licenses given to D. Evans and Boneberg, Conservatives.

THE UNIVERSITY SCANDAL

"The Scandal of University Education in Ireland" is the title of an article in the "Nineteenth Century" for June, from the pen of Sir George T. Lambert, C.B. The article is statesmanlike in its recognition of the facts and necessities of the existing situation, and thoroughly honest in its exposition of the real nature of the Irish claim.

But in England generally, Sir George Lambert declares, the seriousness of the question appears never to have been grasped. He puts it in a form that should impress his readers. Out of 3,369,000 Catholics in Ireland—over 74 per cent. of the entire population—there are only some 250 lay students in receipt of higher education in the colleges endowed by the State, or, in other words, one in every 13,000 of the population; while of the Episcopalian Protestants, 581,000 in number, forming 13 per cent. of the entire population, there were at the date of the Royal Commission in Dublin University alone 1,000 students, or about one in every 580 persons of that denomination.

er education, and that this is the obstacle to a settlement, is wholly unfounded. He quotes the declaration of the Bishops, dated June, 1897, on that point. He points out that the University asked for would be open to all comers, and that there is no demand for the public endowment of a Chair of Theology.

Upon the question of a settlement Sir George Lambert is no less frank and thorough. The arrangement proposed by the Royal Commission "would be an improvement on the existing state of things," but it goes without saying that "the proposals of the Commissioners do not establish equality, nor do these proposals for that reason afford any prospect of finality."

Loisy's Books

Vox Urbis of the New York Freeman's Journal, has learned on respectable authority that before long a further and very serious condemnation of the Abbe Loisy's writings will be published by the Holy Office. For those who may not understand the subject, it may be well to explain that Loisy was until lately a professor in the Catholic University of Paris. He prepared what he says he meant to be a defense of Catholic Christianity against the attacks of the German rationalist, Harnack, and the way he defended Christianity was this: He proclaimed that Our Lord never taught that He was God; he stated that there is no historical proof in the Gospels of the resurrection; he insisted that Our Lord made a mistake as to the nearness of the end of the world; he laid it down that it was not Our Lord, but the Apostles, who established the Church. Moreover, he did all this in very poor French. His ideas had not even the doubtful merit of originality—his are to be found passing in the works of rationalists. Loisy's teachings were condemned—but Loisy did not submit to the judgment of the Church and Loisy's friends (for, strange to say, there are some within the Church who have sympathized with his teachings) continue to grumble that he has been badly treated, and that, at any rate, his words contain only minor errors.
