To Whom it May Concerning I have lately learned that an incident which occurred in Greenwich school about two mouths ago regarding religious instruction, is becoming a subject of conversation both here and in Wolfville; and as the lacts have not been given to the public their intermation is not very clear on the points involved and their comments, as I have some reason to know, are of such a nature as to call for some statement from me.

I had supposed that when the Supt. of Public instruction, the trustees and teachers acceded to my request as a right under the Nova Scotia law, that the matter would be dropped. That public attention should be attracted in any degree was not to be hoped for.

The N. S. taw on the aubject of feligions instruction in schools instructs the teacher to inculcate by precept and example a respect for religion and the principles of Christian morality. If this were done I would only be too pleased with such a disposition of the question as far as I am concerued, but I feel compelled to add that I fany Mohamunedan or infidel objected to the insertion of the word 'Christian' in the law as quoted I should in fairness to them agree; that, a sectarian teaching has no place in a non-sectarian school. With all due respect to the teachers, who no doubt feel helpless in the face of custom, I must say that the meaningless ceremontes performed in our schools in the name of religion, are not only worse than worthless but not in accordance with Nova Scotia law.

If this view is correct, and I am ready to uphold it, of what crinic against society am I guilty when I unkee the very mildest possible protest by requesting that my children be non-participantia in these exercises? It is a custom of which I complain. I blame no one in particular, but if there are people who wish to place the finger of condemuation upon me I only ask them to study the subject before doing so, and them it the public interest seems to demand it I shall be only too happy to reply in full—

Westmorland County.

The vote on the Canada Temperance Act in Westmorland county, Thursday, resulted in the retention of the law by a large majority. The number of votes polled was 7,157, a larger number than in any previous election, and practically the same sia in provincial and federal elections, showing the great interest taken, in the question. The majority for the Act was 699, a sufficiently emphatic declaration of the people's approval of the law after an experience of twenty-cight years of its working and effects. The repeal movement was promoted by the illicit fluor sellers of the county, backed by their followers in the linecused traffic in St. John and elsewhere. They made no gabilic advocacy of their cause, in which they were wise, for it will not bear the light of open discussion. They were again and again invited to present their case in the meetings held by the friends of law, but declined the invitations.
