

Sydney, N. S. W., March 21.—A hurricane on March 6th swept over the New Hebrides Islands and new Caledonia, destroying many villages and causing great loss of life. A large number of natives are said to have perished, and extensive districts are devastated. New Caledonia forms, with the neighboring islands, a most important penal colony of Fronce. The hurricane raged incessently for three days, and the rainfall was enormous. In Tchio alone ten persons were drowned. Half of New Caledonia is flooded. The loss of property will be at \$129,000.
