

SANTIAGO SURRENDER

Twenty-Five Thousand Spanish Soldiers Now in Transport to Spain.

Water Famine Was Imminent and the Besieged City Was in Disperate Condition.

American Troops Hasten to Shift Their Camp to Avoid the Dread Fever.

On board the Steamer New York, July 15.—Admiral Sampson has not yet been informed of the details of the capitulation of Santiago and does not expect that the terms will be made public for several days.

General Shafter bears his honors modestly. He corresponds to the Associated Press. He says: "The enemy has surrendered all territory and troops east of San Diego. The city has been captured from Washington. It has been a hard campaign, one of the hardest I ever saw."

The resistance of the enemy has been exceedingly stubborn. Gen. Toral has proved himself a worthy opponent. The negotiations, which culminated in the surrender, have been dragging on for ten days.

Washington, July 14.—The first chapter in the land campaign of the United States against Spain closed today, when the Spanish colors over Santiago gave place to the American flag.
