The Valley Telephone Company.

The Board of Directors of the above company met in Dr. Sprague's office, Middle-

ton, Monday evening, Feb. 15, to discuss the

business of construction and make such

changes in the running of the business as

was necessary in the transition from a line

under construction to one completed and in

operation. The directors, upon careful in-

vestigation, expressed their perfect satis-

faction with the management during the

year, and their finding was corroborated by

the auditor's report, submitted to the stock-

holders the following afternoon.

As will be seen by the President's report, the

net earnings for the three months ending

with 1892, amounted to \$692.00. This

period was in reality but two and a half

months, as the middle of October would

represent the average of the time on which

the whole line was opened for business. After

providing for a dividend at the rate of 10

per cent. per annum, which the directors

declared on paid-up stock, for the time the

line was in operation last year, a handsome

percentage of the revenue is carried to

reserves. A slight change in the tariff over

joint lines was found to be imperative, in order

to put the business of this company on a

footing with that of the Nova Scotia Tele-

phone Company. The change is expressed in

the following resolution:

Resolved, That after the 1st day of Octo-

ber, 1893, the tariff charges on messages going

over joint lines of the Valley Telephone Co.

and the Nova Scotia Telephone Co. be the

same to subscribers as non-subscribers. The

rates to subscribers of the Valley Tele-

phone Company's own lines will remain as

heretofore.

The stockholders' meeting was held in

scribed stock was represented. After the

agent of a Yarmouth clothing house take

credit and sell his goods all over the county

without paying one cent of taxes to the

subsidity while our own merchants are

taxed on every dollar of their stock? We

know no reason whatever. In many cities
