SAYS PARE HAD NO HELP FROM OUTSIDE
AND IT'S THE SAME COAT.

The Opinion of Inspector Chamberlain After Making a Full Investigation at Napanee.

Arch-Criminal Had Given Several Warnings That He Intended to Tramp—Mackie Will Ask For a New Trial.

Inspector Chamberlain Back.
Says There Was No Outside Influence to Help Pare Out of Jail.

Inspector's Investigation.
Prison Inspector Chamberlain arrived in town last night, and made a thorough investigation of the jail this forenoon. What his report will be, and whether any or all of the officials will be discharged, is not known. This much, however, he made public, that with the implements found in his coat pocket, and the iron bar, in his opinion Pare could easily make his escape without outside assistance or the use of skeleton keys.

Pare is a Cripple.
Pare suffers a good deal from rheumatism in his left arm, and also in his leg. When the barber went to the jail Sunday morning to shave him, as was his weekly custom, he said Pare's leg was greatly swollen, and that he walked with difficulty.

Theories Launched.
The outside assistance theory and the ladder legend are laughed at on all hands, and even the sheriff is becoming sceptical about its plausibility. There are no marks on the zinc flashing at the top of the wall that could have been made by a ladder resting against its delicate edge. The marks which, it is said, were made by dragging up the ladder in the soft, oozing ground and grass, do not run parallel, as they should if made by the ends of a ladder. Where the lines start the marks are faint, and the process of dragging them a distance of about three feet they gradually and evenly spread to a distance of over two feet.

That Mortar.
The mortar under Pare's window, which the sheriff thinks was knocked out of the wall by the pushing the ladder up to the window, was evidently thrown up by Pare, as he is known to have been in the hole in the wall.

Day-Watchman McCoy's Job.
House-cleaning is going on in the jailer's office. McCoy had a busy time carrying out the furniture and carpets of the day-watchman's office, and on the green sward in front of the residence.

Pare Gave Warning.
It looked odd to-day from an official that Pare had for several weeks past given them notice that he would shortly be on the tramp. He was expected to be released from the jail on the 27th inst., and he was so impressed with the serious nature of the escape that he told him it should be made in a matter of two weeks he would be again on the tramp, and it would be a matter of two weeks ago yesterday.

Where Did He Get the Wire?
Where did Pare get the wire? All the officials from the sheriff down never tire of asking. "Why don't you ask something about it?" said a Government detective, and the local officials don't fail to furnish him with a nine-inch pie, a piece of brass, wire, and a piece of wood, which he could make a delicate Yale lock key with the rule file he claimed he did in his cell, and the Crown were delighted with his answer.

PLUMB KILLED MASTERTON.
A Director of the Farmers' Loan and Trust Company Shot Down Without Warning.

FIVE BULLETS FIRED INTO HIM.
The Tragedy Took Place at the Burlington Hotel, Where the Men Met by Appointment.

Plumb Killed Masterston.
New York, May 3.—Alexander Masterston, a director of the Farmers' Loan and Trust Company, and 72 years old, was shot and killed this afternoon by James Neale Plumb in the Burlington Hotel on West 30th street. Masterston was shot five times and died within an hour or two. The murder was premeditated, as evidenced by the voluminous statements written in advance by Plumb and given out after his arrest. At present the real motive for the crime is unknown. Plumb, in his statements issued to the public and entitled "Why I Shot Neale Plumb," shot Alexander Masterston, declared that he had been actuated to do the shooting because of a systematic hunt for Plumb which he had been carrying on for many years. Plumb's statements, one of which was addressed to the Associated Press, dealt with a period of his career embracing the past 20 years, are running in places and coincide with the following:
"No man has a higher regard for human life than I have. I have never known of any punishment of Alexander Masterston as decreed by an outraged God, and I am simply the humble instrument in His hands, as He has selected me as His chosen instrument of wrathful vengeance. I have rid the world of a man who was not fit to live, and whose death a thousand times over could never atone for the monstrous wrong done me."
Met by Agreement.
Masterston and Plumb met by agreement in the Burlington Hotel at 1.30 a.m. in the apartments occupied by Manager Cole. They had been there but a short time when Plumb came out of the apartments and walked into the reception room, awaiting arrest.

Lord Kitchener's envoy, numbering 120, of whom 120 were killed.

INDIGNATION AT LAGOS.
Writ for Slander Issued Against Anglican Bishop Tugwell.

LONDON, May 3.—A despatch from Lagos, West Africa, says that the Europeans there are very indignant at the statement made by the Right Rev. Herbert Tugwell, Anglican Bishop of Equatorial Africa, in a letter to the London Times on March 27, to the effect that 75 per cent. of the deaths of Europeans on the coast of the west coast of Africa were due to drunkenness. A writ for slander has been issued against Bishop Tugwell, which will be served on him at the present moment, as he is on his way to England.

THE TRANSVAAL PROBLEM.
Will Britain Guarantee Kruger's Independence in Return for Burgher Rights to Uitlanders?

SITUATION OF THE STRIKES.

The Brickmakers of Toronto Junction Went Out Without Giving the Least Notice.

THE MANUFACTURERS COMPLAIN

How the Strikes Go on Within the City—Strikers Get Seven Dollars a Week.

Toronto Junction, May 3.—(Special)—Very little progress towards a settlement of the strike is as yet reported. The brick-makers held another meeting at the Heydon House last night, at which nothing more was done than has already been reported, and to-night the owners of brick-works met at the Heydon House to discuss the situation among themselves.

Sympathetic Strike. So long as the bricklayers' strike continues in the city the brick manufacturers say they would just as leave have their yards idle, as they would be manufacturing out of brick, and have so much on hand when building did best.

Manufacturers Complain. The brick-makers are unreasonable in their demands, in that they ask for higher wages than were ever paid, inclusive of the year 1936, when they were paid \$3.50 a week.

The Men's Wages. The men here are not paid by the day, except clay diggers, who receive 15¢ per hour. On this account those receiving high wages are often laid on an account of rain and sometimes lose two or three days in the week.

Looks Like a Long One. It looks as if the brickmakers' strike will last for a long time.

Are Demands Exorbitant? The disagreement between the brick-makers and the manufacturers is still unbroken.

No-Word Yet. The stonecutters met yesterday in Richmond Hill, but as yet have received no word from their employers.

End Perhaps To-Day. The situation of the ironworkers' strike is unchanged. The men waited at Richmond Hill all day yesterday expecting a reply from the bosses but up to last night nothing was received.
