Report of the Kirk Session,

FOR THE YEAR 1879.

The number admitted to the membership during the year was 109.

There were registered: Baptisms 24, Marriages 6, and Burials 10.

The number of certificates of dismissal granted during the year was 8; and, after revising the Communion Roll, the number of members now stands at 445.

A second call was extended to the Rev. A. B. Mackay, of Brighton, England, on 15th January, 1879. This call was accepted by him, and he was inducted into the pastoral charge of this congregation on the 15th May, 1879.

During the year, previous to the induction of Mr. Mackay, the pulpit was supplied by the Reverends Professor Gregg, of Toronto; A. F. Kemp, Ottawa; Dr. Parsons, Buffalo; Professor Campbell, Montreal; Dr. Topp, Toron-

to; J. M. King, Toronto; E. F. Torrance, Peterboro'; Dr. Wardrope, Guelph, and Dr. McVicar.

In the month of January, at the request of the Session, the congregation elected five additional Elders, and on the 2nd February the following were duly ordained to the office of Elder, namely: Messrs. Peter Nicholson, Joseph Mackay, Hugh Watson, and at the same time David Cameron, who had been previously ordained, was inducted.

The Sabbath School is in vigorous operation, still under the superintendence of Mr. D. Morrice, assisted by Mr. Hugh Watson and a good staff of teachers, a report of which will, as usual, appear by itself.

Report of the Deacons' Court

FOR THE YEAR ENDING 31st DECEMBER, 1879.

The Deacons' Court, in presenting their usual Annual Report, would gratefully acknowledge the good hand of our God upon us as a people during the past year.

From the Financial Statements to be submitted it will be seen that the amount raised for the support of ordinances is largely in excess of any year in the history of this congregation. While this has been the case, it is gratifying to find that the missionary and other benevolent schemes of the church have not suffered in consequence.

SUSTENTATION FUND.

The total receipts for the year amount to \$7,837.18, as compared with \$4,228.81 in 1878, an increase of \$3,608.37. Receipts from Pew rents show an increase of \$2,166.38, and plate collections \$398.53.

The disbursements for the support of ordinances, and the working expenses of the Congregation amount this year to \$6,399.98 as against \$4,869.71 in 1878, an increase of \$1,530.27. The year commenced with a balance due the Treasurer of \$605.61, while we close the year with a balance in the Treasurer's hands of \$27.50.

POOR FUND.

This Fund, as in former years, has been liberally sustained by the congregation. The balance at its credit in last report was \$192.68, to which was added during the year the sum of \$538.19. The amount expended has been \$364.55, leaving in the hands of the Treasurer the sum of \$366.32.

MISSIONARY AND BENEVOLENT SOCIETY.

The amount for distribution this year will, it is thought, be somewhat in advance of the previous year. The accounts not yet having been closed, the exact sum raised cannot now be stated. A full statement of the work of the Association will be submitted to the congregation early in February, when the Annual Report will be presented.

As it is desirable that *all* should contribute to this Fund, it is hoped that those who may not have been visited by the collectors, will intimate to the Secretary, Mr. Hyde, their desire to be regularly called upon.

LADIES' VISITING AND AID SOCIETY.

This Association, organized for the purpose of making up and distributing articles of clothing to those connected with us requiring such assistance, continues to do a good work in that direction. In the way of outside effort, aid was also given to the Nazareth Street School, the Canning Street School, and to the Ladies' French Mission Rooms. From the Report appended, it will be seen that the amount disbursed during the year, was \$153.28, leaving a balance in the Treasurer's hands of \$12.29.

PEW REPORT.

The Court having found it necessary to make a small advance in the rent of some of the Pews, to meet the current expenses of the Church, parties occupying such pews were duly notified of the change, which took effect on 1st of January, 1880.

The 200 copies of the C edition at the foot of this list were procured expressly for the use of strangers and for the Congregation at its practisings of Sacred song.

For both these purposes they have been found exceedingly useful.

CHURCH SABBATH SCHOOL.

The welfare of the Sabbath School being so closely identified with that of the Church, it is gratifying to have to record a continued increase in its growth, and this not-withstanding the withdrawal of a considerable number of the older pupils who have connected themselves with the Bible Class. The amount raised for Missionary purposes by the children during the year will, we are assured, reach the sum of \$250.00.

Mr. D. Morrice, who has so long and faithfully performed the duties of Superintendent, still continues in that position, as does Mr. H. Watson, as Assistant Superintendent, their efforts being seconded by an efficient staff of teachers.

BIBLE CLASS.

Notwithstanding the many duties devolving upon him, as Principal of our Theological College, Dr. McVicar kindly offered to take charge of the Bible Class during the winter months. The subject of study, viz: "Readings in the Pentateuch, illustrative of the Unity of the Church of God," has proved most interesting and instructive, as is evidenced by the large attendance at the class, averaging about one hundred. All who can, especially the young people of the Congregation, should avail themselves of the opportunity thus offered, of acquainting themselves with a subject at once so interesting, and so ably presented. The class meets in the Lecture Room, on Sabbath afternoons, at a quarter past four o'clock.

CHURCH LIBRARY.

No additions have been made to the Library during the year. The number of those who avail themselves of its use is still comparatively small. This is to be regretted, as there is on its shelves a large number of most excellent works. Mr. David Campbell, the librarian, is in attendance on Wednesday evenings before and after the service.

CHURCH PSALMODY.

To Mr. McLaren, and the members of the Choir, we are, as usual, greatly indebted for their efficient services in connection with our psalmody, and their efforts in this direction are, we are sure, duly appreciated by the Congregation.

In this connection, it may not be out of place to refer to the series of congregational practises inaugurated by our Pastor, and held after the usual Wednesday evening lecture, for the purpose of acquiring a more intimate acquaintance with the tunes in our church hymnal. The large number attending these meetings gave evidence on the part of the congregation that they were alive to the importance of this part of our worship, and the results attained will, it is hoped, lead to a repetition of these practises during a part, at least, of our winter months.

YOUNG MEN'S ASSOCIATION.

After a lapse of some years this society was revived in November last. Its objects, according to its constitution, are declared to be—"The religious, moral and intellectual improvement of its members." In relation to the number of names enrolled, it has thus far had a successful course, but it would be premature to speak yet of success in other respects. If its objects are perseveringly and consistently sought to be realized (and there is no reason to doubt but they will) then the Society will be a powerful auxiliary to the other organizations of the church. All the meetings are opened and closed with prayer. There are readings, essays and

NAZARETH STREET MISSION HOUSE.

The Sabbath School meeting in this building celebrated its twentieth Anniversary on the evening of Christmas Day, when there was a large attendance of the parents and friends of the children. The scholars on the roll number 261, with a staff of 22 teachers. An interesting feature in connection with the working of the School in the past has been that teachers from several Presbyterian and other Evangelical Churches have been found to work so earnestly and harmoniously together, and we trust such will be the case in the time to come. Now that the School is altogether connected with this Congregation, it is hoped that a lively interest will be manifested in this department of Christian work; and that a permanent Missionary will be placed in the field, so that Sabbath and week-day services may be carried on in connection with the work of the Sabbath School.

PETITE COTE SABBATH SCHOOL.

During the past year this School was brought into connection with this Congregation, when the Schools of the Association were allocated to the several Churches. It still continues under the superintendence of Mr. Greig. The number in attendance averages about 30 for the year, of whom over 20 are grown up young men and women, from 17 to 30 years of age. The School house during last summer received a new iron roof, at the expense of this Congregation, which has made the building much more comfortable.

IN CONCLUSION.

Having thus laid before you a brief review of the work of the past year, we cannot conclude without referring to the settlement amongst us in May last, of the Rev. A. B. Mackay, late of Brighton, England, whose ministrations as our pastor have proved so acceptable. That his work in connection with this Congregation may be long continued and greatly blessed, is, we are sure, the earnest prayer of each and every one connected with us.

ANNUAL REPORT

OF THE

Missionary and Benevolent Society.

MONTREAL, 4th February, 1880.

At the close of another year it becomes the duty of your Committee to present a brief summary of the work of the Society. In doing so, we have abundant cause for thankfulness for the spirit of Christian liberality which has been manifested by the Congregation. Notwithstanding many special calls, to which a liberal response was made, we are enabled to confirm the hope expressed by the Deacons' Court at the recent Annual Meeting of the Congregation, to the effect that the results of the year would not be less than that of 1878, the fact being that we are somewhat in advance, as will appear by the Treasurer's Statement to be submitted at this meeting.

Of the collections appointed to be taken up by the General Assembly, the following have been made:

Home Missions, Foreign Missions, Presbyterian College of Montreal, and French Evangelization.

Out of the monthly contributions we have still to provide for the following objects:

Nazareth Street Sabbath School, Students' Missionary Society, Presbyterian *Record*, Proportion of Salary of City Missionary, And other incidental demands. The number of Missionary Collectors remains the same as last year, and they have faithfully performed their respective duties. It is expected that in revising the Districts we shall require additional help, and we confidently anticipate that there will be a hearty response when called upon.

In our last Annual Report attention was called to the increased responsibility placed upon us by the special care of the Nazareth street and Petite Cote schools. At the latter it was found necessary to re-roof the School house, which has been done. The school is under the care of Mr. William Greig, who reports satisfactory progress in the work.

At the Nazareth street Mission there has been little or no extra charges, while your Committee are gratified in being able to report that the school continues prosperous under the care of Mr. James Ross, with an efficient staff of teachers.

Your Committee would take this opportunity of urging upon all members and adherents of the Congregation the duty of giving statedly through the regular Collectors. In this way a great deal of time and trouble might be saved, and the Society be in a position to allocate the givings of the people from month to month, instead of waiting till the close of the year as at present. Any who may not be called upon by the Collectors, that are desirous of contributing, will kindly send their names and addresses to the Secretary, so that they may be placed upon the Collectors' books.

ANNUAL REPORT.

MONTREAL, 16th January, 1880.

In submitting our report for the past year we would desire to record our thankfulness and gratitude to God for the happy settlement of a pastor, under whose ministrations and guidance we trust that this portion of his charge shall be more and more prosperous.

Attendance.—In consequence of the more favorable position of our Church we had been looking forward to an increase in numbers, and although we have not added many new

names to our roll, yet we are pleased to note an addition in this connection. Our statistics are as follows:—

These figures would have appeared more favorable had not the resumption of the Bible Class under the care of the Rev. Principal MacVicar taken away about twenty-five of our more advanced scholars.

The average attendance at Principal MacVicar's Bible Class is 91.

With respect to our staff of Teachers the numbers are the same as last year.

Scheme of Lessons.—The use of the "International Scheme of Lessons" was continued during the year.

Meetings.—The only change we have to report in this connection is the discontinuance of the meeting for prayer at the close of the Sabbath exercises. It was with much regret that we took this step, which was done in order to relieve the Teachers in time to attend the Bible class, the hour of opening being the same as that at which our meeting was held. The ordinary Sabbath exercises continued to be held at three o'clock, while business meetings were held at such times as were considered necessary.

Missions.—We regret that the result of our year's work in Missions has not been so satisfactory as we could have wished, yet taking into account the loss of our senior scholars, already referred to, the deficiency compared with last year is but small. The following is the result:

Library.—We have not been able to make any additions during the year, nor shall we feel ourselves in a position to do so until the amount due for former purchases has been met.

Papers.—" The Children's Friend," "Sabbath School Presbyterian," and "Infant's Magazine," were supplied to the scholars during the year.

Rewards.—In addition to the prizes offered for correct recital of the Shorter Catechism, a medal was offered for the best written examination upon the Golden Texts in the scheme of lessons for the year, the book, chapter and verse being given. Two scholars responded, and the result of the examination was so gratifying that it was decided to present each of them with a book. For the Shorter Catechism recitation there were no competitors in the first section, that is for the whole of the questions, but in the second section, for fifty questions, eight came forward, five of whom were found perfect after a most thorough examination, and the other three were almost correct, one mistake being made by each.

For diligence in Missions the Infant Class did remarkably well, the amount contributed being in excess of last year, while the number of boxes was about the same.

Concerts.—We have not been able to do anything in this connection, although it is the desire of the teachers to get up some entertainment, the proceeds of which might be applied in aid of the Library Fund.

Conclusion.—This brief recital will show the nature of the work undertaken. As to the result of our labors, while we have good reason to believe that our efforts have not been in vain, we leave all in the hands of Him who has called us to labor in his cause, trusting in and looking to Him for a blessing upon the seed sown that it may bear much fruit. Again seeking the sympathy and prayers of the Congregation in our behalf, that God would bless and prosper us, so that through our instrumentality many of the young may be gathered into the fold of the Great Shepherd.

ANNUAL REPORT

OF THE

Cadies' Disiting and Aid Society.

The first meeting of the Society was held on Tuesday, November 4th.

Mrs. Mackay was gladly welcomed to our midst and was asked to fill the office of President.

A vote of thanks was presented to Mrs. McVicar for having filled that office so long and so faithfully.

The ladies have to thank the Congregation for their generous response to the annual appeal for funds to enable them to carry on the work of the Society. The collections this year amounted to \$150.55, a sum considerably in advance of the two preceding years. This was well, as the cases were more numerous, and even more urgent, than they have been for some time.

Fourteen families were visited and their necessities relieved.

A donation of ten dollars, and different lengths of material for clothing, boots, etc., were given to Nazareth St. Sabbath School.

At one of our meetings, a letter was read from Mrs. Campbell, President of the Ladies' French Evangelization Society, asking us to aid them in furnishing a mission house to enable them to carry on their work more efficiently. It was decided to give ten dollars to this good work.

One of our members urged the claims of Canning Street Congregation, and called attention to the extreme destitution of many of the families connected with it.

It was thought advisable to ask the Rev. Mr. Mackay to make an appeal from the pulpit for this object, as well as for Nazareth Street School. Several parcels were sent in answer to this appeal, which we would now beg to acknowledge.

Although ours has been a quiet and not a very extensive work, we trust those visited have been cheered in spirit, as well as materially aided; and we would remind those who have sought, in however small a degree, to speak a sympathetic word, or do a loving deed, that the Master says to such, "Inasmuch as ye have done it unto one of the least of these, my brethren, ye have done it unto Me."

Memoranda.

- PUBLIC WORSHIP on Sabbath commences at 11 o'clock A.M., and 7 o'clock P.M.
- WEEKLY PRAYER MEETING in the Lecture Room every Wednesday evening at 8 o'clock. The second Wednesday of each month is devoted to the imparting of missionary intelligence.
- SABBATH SCHOOL meets every Sabbath afternoon at 3 o'clock, except on Communion Sabbaths, when special services are held at half-past 3. The Teachers' meeting for business is held on the second Thursday of each month.
- THE SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM is dispensed at the forenoon service on the first Sabbath of each month. Applicants must give notice to the Minister during previous week.
- THE ELDERS visit their districts quarterly and distribute cards for the communion. Any who may not receive their cards from the Elders, can get them at the close of the Friday Preparatory Service, or from the Elders at the door on Communion Sabbath morning. When members change their residence, immediate notice should be given to the Elder of the district or to the Minister.
- THE SACRAMENT OF THE LORD'S SUPPER is dispensed on the second Sabbaths of March, June, September and December. On these occasions the whole of the collection on both morning and evening services are devoted to the Poor Fund.

- THE STATED MONTHLY MEETING OF THE SESSION is held on the first Tuesday of each month.
- THE STATED MONTHLY MEETING OF THE DEACONS'
 COURT is held on the first Monday of each month.
- THE MISSIONARY COLLECTORS visit their districts once a month to receive contributions for the Missionary and Benevolent Society. Attendance is given in one of the Committee Rooms on the first Wednesday of each month, half an hour before the meeting opens, to receive the amounts from the collectors.
- THE LADIES' VISITING AND AID SOCIETY meets once a week during the working season.
- ATTENDANCE is given in the Church on the first Tuesdays of January, April, July and October, from half-past 7 till 9 o'clock P.M., for the purpose of letting pews or sittings, and receiving pew rents. These purposes can be served at any other time by applying to Mr. R. N. M'CALLUM, corner Phillips' Square and St. Catherine Street, who has the Seat Book and Plan of the Church, or to the Church Officer on the premises.
- THE CONGREGATIONAL LIBRARY is free to all the Congregation, and is open every Wednesday evening at the close of the Lecture.
