REPORT OF SESSION.

The Session has little of special interest to report. The ordinary work of the congregation has been going on during the year with no special features of either encouragement or discouragement. In making up its return on the state of Religion, the Session saw ground to report the condition of the congregation spiritually, as encouraging rather than otherwise. It must be felt, however, that it is an unhappiness to be able to say no more and the session would appeal to those in the congregation who occupy the position of the Lord's Remembrancers, to remember the Congregation and the Pastor, at the Throne of Grace, supplicating that the arm of the Lord

may be revealed amongst us.

At the close of last year 231 members were reported. To those have been added this year 10, one by certificate and nine by profession, three of these being received at the Communion in June and 7 at the Communion in To contra-balance this gain there were 12 removals from the roll, three by death and nine by leaving the bounds of the Congregation. The three who have been taken from us, we hope to their own great gain, were Mrs. Thos. Mitchell, sr., Mrs. Dobie and Mrs. Joseph Pringle, with whose bereaved relatives the Session desires to express its profound sympathy and to hope for them the blessings of being partakers of that faith, in the The nine removed from the hope of which their relatives departed this life roll were Mr. and Mrs. McNally, Kate McNally, Mr and Mrs. Horn, Mrs. and Miss Garrett and Miss Gannerman, all of whom the Session follows There have been eleven baptisms during this year, with its good wishes. that is when rightly understood, eleven new members have been received into the church, upon whom, being spared to years of understanding, will rest the responsibility of accepting the membership, which by right is theirs.

The Sabbath Schools at Arnett, Sullivan, Rockford and Chatsworth, were maintained this as last year. The reports from the three first were too late of being asked for to appear now, but all met with a fair measure of encour agement, the Chatsworth school, under the superintendency of Mr. McGill, having on its roll 54, with an average of 40, with 8 teachers and contribution to Missions of about \$20. The Prayer Meetings in the country, which were resumed after the winter Sacrament, have been held since, weather remitting. Besides innumerable special visits, the Pastor, with one or two exceptions, visited the whole congregation last year, and hopes again to accomplish it completely this year. In submitting this report the Session would remind the Congregation of the absolute necessity of prayer for the spiritual well being, both of the congregation and of individuals. It is an essential condition of spiritual prosperity, and we can hope for nothing better for the coming year than for a larger portion of the spirit of prayer.

REPORT OF DEACONS' COURT.

In submitting the Annual Report of the Deacons' Court this year, we regret to find that the centributions both to the Stipend Fund and Schemes of the Church are becoming less every year. The Report will show that although nearly as many have paid this year as paid formerly yet the amount of individual subscriptions is less in many cases than they were in former years, thus accounting for the defficiency in the Stipend Fund. We hope that another year will make a better showing in this respect.
