There has been also formed in connection with the congregation a Christian Endeavor Association, composed of three branches, one in Sullivan, one at Arnott and the third in Chatsworth. Remembering the peril of putting the hand to the plough and looking back, the Session earnestly recommends the young people to the interest and prayers of the congregation. The usual prayer meetings in the various districts of the congregation have been, with some intermission, maintained throughout the year and still are attended with an encouraging measure of support.

#### REPORT OF THE DEACON COURT.

In submitting the report of the Deacon's Court this year, we can say that it is, on the whole, the most favorable report for several years. The contributions for the stipend have been a little over the amount required to pay the minister's salary. The amount contributed for church schemes is about the average. The most encouraging part of the report is that we have reduced the debt of the church building \$800.00, which reduces the interest \$56. All interest has been paid in full to date.

We heartily thank the Ladies' Aid for the help they have given us, they having paid the Treasurer during the year no less a sum than \$331.77.
