THE GRAND TRUNK PACIFIC PORT.

If the Grand Trunk Pacific proposes to ship its western freight by a Canadian port, it will need something more than a truck and a rolling stock. There will be need of terminal accommodations and equipment.

The company desired to stop at North Bay, where the old Grand Trunk line could be taken for Montreal. Quebec was next proposed, but that was the same thing, since the Grand Trunk lines already reach Lévis.

Petersen and Tate, who contracted with the St. John's Railway for the fast Atlantic service, put up a deposit of \$50,000 that they would carry out their agreement. They got extensions of time and other concessions. Some years ago they threw up the job, saying that they could not do it for the money.
