

Next year the number of teachers will be increased by five.

Saskatchewan is establishing at Saskatoon a uni-versity which is not hampered by any vested college rights. It is an absolutely new creation. The plan contemplates the erection of a score of university build-ings and the establishment of more separate faculties than are now found in any Canadian university. While all this is not to be accomplished at once, the educational leaders in that province start out with the assumption that Saskatchewan is to have a larger population than that Saskatchewan is to have a larger population than all Canada has now. They are laying a foundation for all these prospective millions, and do not propose to repent their lack of faith.
