Mercy for Those Shielding as None are Likely to Paris, April 16.—The French began an attack this morning, after several days of artillery preparation, between Solssons and Rheims. Sev-eral German lines were carried and more than ten thousand Germans were taken prisoner. The official announcement of this success issued by the war office tonight describes the fighting as being of the utmost violence. The text of the statement reads: "Retween St. Quentin and the Qiae artillery fighting continued violence. The text of the statement reads: "Between St. Quentin and the Olse artillery fighting continued throughout the day. South of the Olse we made new progress on the plateau east of the line of Barisla-Quincy Basse. ATTACKED ON FRONT OF TWENTY-FIVE MILES. "Batween Solesons and Rheims, after artillery preparation which lasted several days, we attacked this morning the German lines along an extent of about forty kilometres (25 miles.) A desperate battle was fought along the whole front, where the ensemy had grouped very im-perant forces and numerous artillery. T happened on the Somme. It was a bad night. After enduring their "spell" of several eventful days in the muddy trenches the -th Canadians were dragging themselves in the rain along the dreary four mile mud trail back to bivouacs. They stopped at the Y.M.C.A. "hut," and many thanked God for this visible sign that the good folks at home cared. Tea, coffee, biscuits, etc., were gratefully received, and they were about to resume their trudge to billets and - - REST!

But the Y.M.C.A. secretary prevailed upon the reluctant Colonel to remain awhile for a bit of a sing-song. The men slowly filed in and pretty soon the air was filled with one merry ragtime tune after another. What did it matter that that busy old battered piano had seen better days! When the boys were tired of ragtime, they listened to "Annie Laurie" and "Home Sweet Home" and there was a film over many an eye. Then they passed on to "Rock of Ages" and "Abide With

Me." That was all. No time this for addresses to the men. Bivouac must be reached—but oh, how differently they resumed the road. They were marching and whistling now! On the way they halted. Said the Colonel to his adjutant, "That Y.M.C.A. secretary must be thanked again," so back he went through the mud to emphasize his grateful appreciation of what the Y.M.C.A. meant to his men.
