RESTORING FRANCE.

Authoritative statements, based upon investigation, have just been published with reference to France and the work of rehabilitation that has been accomplished since the conclusion of the war.

A POLICY OF DISASTER.

According to the latest available statistics there are 22,000 industries in Canada, representing an investment of \$2,000,000,000, employing 600,000 men and paying out in wages annually \$250,000,000.

A calculation made at Ottawa has it that if Canada can meet current expenses of the government, provide interest on the public debt and set aside \$125,000,000 a year as sinking fund, her debt obligations may be liquidated by the end of 1937.

CIVIL SERVANTS AND POLITICS.

While there are many features of the Railway Board's method of managing the C. N. IRELAND AND THE IRISH.

(The Outlook)

It was not the Irish who made the witty remark at a political meeting in answer to an unbecoming interruption: "When the red-hot iron of prejudice is plunged into the water of truth, the result is always a hiss." We call that sort of thing "typically Irish."

Why did I not go to the open Bible and the trope of Rome? Why? If it were not so terribly tragic, this constant dwelling on the past, it would be laughable.

The plain fact is, Ireland at this hour is feudalistic. She is a late-comer on the modern stage. Abstract theories of government have no charm for her; abstract equity she hates.

There is something to be said, no doubt, for differences in psychology; yet too much may be made of this, and it is by no means ethnically homogeneous.

It is a profound mistake to suppose so. There is probably more Celtic blood in England than in the whole of Ireland. The average Englishman is not flaxen-haired and blue-eyed. The Scandinavian type is, in fact, the exception.

What is the historic origin of this anachronism of temperament? Why is it that the Irishman is so singularly uninterested in the fierce play of modern forces? Why is he eternally recurring to Emain, the capital of the first world of Mr. Yeats' poetry?

EXPLORER NANSEN TELLS OF PRISONERS

Terrible Position of War Prisoners in Russia is Pictured in Vivid Language.

Geneva, Nov. 18.—It was announced by the League of Nations today that Sir George Foster, Canadian Minister of Trade and Commerce, was elected a vice president of the League of Nations at the first ballot, it was announced by President Hymans this afternoon.

Victim of Translation It developed today that Hon. C. J. Doherty, Canadian Minister of Justice, was one of the most active of the delegates to the assembly, had become a victim of one of the high speed translations made during the assembly's proceedings which sometimes become misstatements. The translator made him say that Canada would abstain from voting on the message of sympathy offered in the assembly for the Russian Revolution.

Explorer and Prisoners Dr. Fridtjof Nansen, of Norway took the floor to report to the assembly the work done in connection with the prisoners of war. He prefaced his remarks with an expression of full accord with and great admiration for the speech delivered yesterday by Lord Robert Cecil and he hoped the committee would take up their work in the spirit which animated Lord Robert's remarks.

Case of the Russian About 180,000 prisoners had been repatriated during the summer, Dr. Nansen announced. About half of these were Russians returned from France and Germany and half the subjects of Central European states returned from Russia.

Millerand Instructs His Delegates to Leave "Bag and Baggage."

VIVIANI MAY BE THE NEXT PREMIER
