

OF THE  
ANNUAL MEETING

OF THE  
WESLEYAN METHODIST MISSIONARY AUXILIARY SOCIETY,  
FOR THE NEW BRUNSWICK DISTRICT,  
HELD IN THE WESLEYAN CHAPEL, FREDERICTON,  
On Tuesday Evening, June 7, 1853.

REV. RICHARD KNIGHT, IN THE CHAIR.

An abstract of the Report of the Committee having been read by the Rev. R. COONEY, M. A., the following resolutions were proposed and adopted by the meeting.

I. Moved by the Rev. John Snowball; seconded by the Rev. Michael Pickles.

That the Report, an abstract of which has been read, be adopted and published.

II. Moved by the Rev. James G. Hennigar; seconded by the Rev. George M. Barrett.

That the success which continues to attend the endeavours of the Parent Society, and also those of the other Evangelical and Protestant Missionary Societies generally, calls for grateful and devout acknowledgement; and this meeting hereby offers its special thanks to *Almighty God*, for the gracious visitations of the *Holy Spirit*, by whose agency that success has been accomplished.

III. Moved by the Rev. Richard Williams; seconded by the Rev. William T. Cardy.

Whereas the Parent Society, acting under the persuasion that the period has arrived when their older Missions, which they have so long and so kindly fostered, should be formed into self-sustaining and self-governing organisations, have recently elevated the French District into a Conference, and contemplate the same change in Australia and other places:—This meeting, hoping that these important arrangements will lead to the more rapid development and diffusion of *The Gospel*, hereby pledges itself to afford all the pecuniary aid it can towards their efficient and successful operation.

IV. Moved by the Rev. William Allen; seconded by the Rev. Ingham Sutcliffe.

Whereas the Parent Society and its numerous patrons have long and anxiously desired to commence operations in China; but having been prevented hitherto, solely for the want of financial means—this meeting rejoices that a special effort of Christian liberality has removed that impediment; and that we now have three Missionaries co-operating with the agents of other Evangelical denominations in order to wrest that vast Empire from "*The Prince of Darkness*," and annex it to the ransomed inheritance of "*the Son of God*."

V. Moved by the Rev. William Smith; seconded by the Rev. Robert A. Chesley.

That the thanks of this meeting be presented to the Collectors and friends of the Society generally, for their valuable services and generous support.

## REPORT, &c.

THE circumstances under which we are assembled furnish abundant evidence that we have come together, for the performance of some special, if not extraordinary duty. The devotional rites in which we have already engaged, show that we are committed to some great religious transaction. The ARK is not in any imminent danger, nor are we obliged to look for it either in EPHRATA or in the fields of the wood. The peace of Sion is not threatened with disruption, and the City of our solemnities is radiant with the glory of the Lord. Our frontiers are not invaded as in the days of the chivalric DEBORAH, nor is the country wasted by fire and sword, as in the days of the heroic JEPHTHAH and GIDEON. We are convened together, not to conclude an armistice with our enemies, but to commemorate our triumphs over them—not to ratify a treaty of peace, but to devise means for more effectually prosecuting a war infinitely more honorable and glorious, than that which animated the followers of GODFREY, or inspired the troops of TANCRED.—The conquest of the Saracens, and the recovery of the holy sepulchre were in accordance with

“The low ambition and the pride of Kings;”

But this Society, as a part of the militant host contemplates the subjugation of “The Prince of Darkness—the salvation of souls—and the extension of the Empire of ‘The Son of Man.’” Their weapons are not carnal but spiritual, and are mighty through God to the pulling down of every strong hold—their motto is onward—and as they advance from conquering to conquer, they perform the grand march of their invincible and glorified commander—

But in addition to all this "The Lord the Spirit" has been poured out upon our beloved people and congregations, in the Saint John Circuits—in Fredericton—and in other sections of the Province.

We cannot indeed, as our Fathers and Brethren have recently done at "THE CENTENARY HALL," exhibit *The Mea offa*, or weapons of barbarian warfare, surrendered by reclaimed and converted cannibals, and sent thither to furnish means for the support of christian missions—we cannot display such trophies as these, but we can speak, and will speak to the praise of HIM who has condescended to use us—to his praise will we speak of carnal minds subdued—of sinners saved by grace—of believers sanctified—and of Saints translated to "The general assembly and Church of the first born in Heaven."

“ Now thanks be unto God, which always causeth us to triumph in Christ, and maketh manifest the savour of his knowledge by us in every place.”

The general report of the venerable Parent Society was read by the Rev. George Osborn, and from this interesting document, we have selected such extracts, as we deemed most likely to gratify the members and friends of this Auxiliary ; and render its TWENTY SEVENTH ANNIVERSARY a devout and joyful commemoration of the loving kindness of God our Saviour.

EUROPE.

IRELAND is still regarded with feelings of the deepest interest, and the warmest sympathy. Circumstances from which worldly policy and rationalism would augur the most unfavourable results, are likely to turn out to the furtherance of the gospel. The operations of “ The encumbered Estates Commission,” and the immense tide of emigration upon which thousands, and tens of thousands of Romanists are annually borne away to other countries are facilitating the labours of Evangelical agents, and opening the doors that have been so long closed against the word, the entrance of which giveth light. The schools are in a very flourishing condition, and numerous instances of signal success have recently followed the preaching of the Cross.

GERMANY.—The Church formed by the Society’s agents at Winnenden continues to exercise a very gracious influence, and to be of a truth, the salt of the Earth, in that sphere, in which it has pleased God to fix the bounds of its habitation. Several additional preaching places have been opened, and at most of them the gospel has been rendered the power of God unto the salvation of precious souls.

FRANCE AND SWITZERLAND.—These countries form very interesting fields of labour, and although they are not now a part of the Mission territories, they are nevertheless, regarded with unabated solicitude and affection. The French Empire and the Swiss Republic are now in a new Ecclesiastical position—are in short a CONFERENCE, and have already adopted measures for commencing a Mission to Italy.

SPAIN.—This wretched country is still bound hand and foot in the chains of Papal superstition and tyranny. The whole country lies festering and putrifying in a stagnant and fetid pool of ignorance and iniquity, and is trodden down by the hoofs of “ The Beast.” At GIBRALTAR, however, the cause of God and of Truth still lives and even prospers. consolidated, and it is to be hoped that this measure will at once promote their efficiency and reduce their expenditure.

#### ASIA.

The mention of this sub-division of the globe excites vivid and conflicting emotions. The Primitive continent—the land of sacred and historical fame—what shall we say of thee—of China—of India—of Persia—of Egypt—of Syria, and their swarming millions of Idolaters and Mahomedans? Here the impious MOLOCH and the filthy DAGON are still honoured, and here the star of REMPHIN still shines. Here the Priests are jugglers and the teachers impostors; and as there is no vision the people perish

“In vain with lavish kindness,  
The gifts of God are strown;  
The heathen in his blindness,  
Bows down to wood and stone.”

CEYLON AND CONTINENTAL INDIA.—The Mission in South Ceylon exhibits several interesting features. This portion of the Island is called “The Singhalese District,” and the latest reports from the various Circuits are highly encouraging. Four new Chapels have been lately erected, and the membership so much augmented, that it now amounts to 1,847. To God be all the praise. The brethren in the Tamul District, or North Ceylon, have passed through a year of much trial and affliction. Two of them have had to return home; but the residue though faint, are yet pursuing, and endeavouring to war a good warfare, and multiply the victories of the Cross.

CONTINENTAL INDIA.—In this immense breadth of territory we have but two districts; the Madras district, and the Mysore district. These are very partially supplied by some 12 or 13 missionaries, and as might be expected the most earnest and touching appeals are made for help. An additional preacher, says the minutes, is wanted for Madras. Three are wanted for the Mysore; and two at least for Goobbee and Toomkoo. In several places the fields are white unto the harvest, and in others there is a shaking among the dry bones.

The native Church at Royapotta, is in a very promising state; at Negapatam too the Lord has been pleased to revive his work. The Educational Establishment at Bangalore, is in a very efficient state, containing no less than 800 boys; and Major-General Cubbon, Commissioner of the Rajah of Mysore, has signified his approval of this department of labour, by a monthly gift of 300 rupees. The printing establishment is carried on with a great deal of vigour, and continues to be a valuable auxiliary for promoting the “glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ.” But INDIA wants more labourers, nor can

we expect any very decided results, so long as there is only one missionary to every million of the population. O Lord make bare thine arm; send forth thy light and thy truth O Lord God of Hosts. Have mercy on INDIA.

CHINA.—Thanks be to God that this name appears at last among our Foreign Stations; and that the society has three missionaries in this remote Empire; and that they have fairly and boldly lifted up a standard for the truth. We must not despise the day of small and feeble things, but on the contrary, expect from this humble commencement a great and glorious sequel. The seed is sown—the blow is struck—the blast of the trumpet has been heard. Let us think of “the little stone” cut out of the mountain, without hands—let us think of the cloud, and its subsequent expansion—of the grain of mustard seed, and its wonderful growth—let us pray for China—let us beg for China—let us give for China, and then, conflicting dynasties, and contending tribes will be at peace, and recognise the Supreme authority of “the King of Kings.”

The Chinese monarchy is supposed to have commenced before Christ 2,367 years; but its actual history cannot be traced any farther than the Greek Olympiads. May the time come when the remoteness of its antiquity shall be forgotten in the extent of its evangelisation.—Amen.

MISSIONS IN AUSTRALASIA AND POLYNESIA.—The state of the work in New South Wales affords ground of mingled encouragement and regret. The removals to the gold mines have been very detrimental to religion. Considerable good has been accomplished by open-air services at the Turon gold mines. God is pleased in a very gracious manner to bless the labours of his servants in various parts of Southern and Western Australia. It is true indeed that the departure of the population from the former place, to the adjoining Province of Victoria, threatened the interests of the Society with almost immediate destruction; but the Lord overruled it for good, and rendered it a blessing to Victoria.

The latest intelligence from Melbourne is of a most gratifying description; and from the zeal which our people manifest for extended Church accommodation, the most blessed results may be anticipated.

The general returns from the Van Dieman's Land District, show that the discovery of the precious metal has been productive of very evil consequences.

NEW ZEALAND.—The accounts from this district are various, and upon the whole not very animating. The work among the natives is

impeded by intercourse with Europeans—the increase in the value of land—and in marketable produce. In a word “*good times*,” as they are called, are militating against the interests of religion.

IN “THE FRIENDLY ISLAND DISTRICT” the work never presented circumstances of greater interest than it did last year. The clouds that have been gathering for a long time have been dispersed: and all the evils that had been dreaded have been averted. Instead of war and its effects we have peace and its fruits. The swords have been turned into plough shares, and the spears into pruning-hooks. The designs of the Romish emissaries have been exposed and frustrated, and the authority of King George fully acknowledged by the French. For these results, the mission is indebted under God, to the conduct and influence of Sir Everard Home, of Her Majesty’s ship *Calliope*.

THE FEEJEE DISTRICT.—The reports from this portion of the Society’s domain, declare a small increase in the number of members, and a large increase in the number of scholars. The Press continues to be very active and influential. Education proceeds and its results are becoming more and more apparent. On the Lakemba circuit—at Vewa and Bau, and in Yandrana, many have been savingly converted to God. Here too the services of the distinguished Officer already mentioned, and those of His Excellency Sir Charles Fitzroy, have been of incalculable advantage. And the committee cannot but rejoice, that in the providence of God, the crown of Great Britain has been so worthily represented in these remote parts of its jurisdiction.

#### AFRICA.

This quarter has witnessed scenes enough to make angels weep, and men blush for shame. Africa has long been an “*Aceldema*,” or *Field of Blood*. The wrongs they have suffered, and still suffer at the hands of their fellow men, have conferred upon the posterity of HAM a melancholy eminence. Saxons and Celts have united to oppress them; and Patriots, while they preached liberty, and declaimed about freedom, helped to rivet their chains. But the work of Emancipation and Regeneration is going on, and Africa will yet be free for “The word of the Lord hath spoken it.”

SOUTHERN AFRICA.—At Cape Town the gold excitement and the disturbed state have exercised an adverse influence, but still encouragement is not wholly wanting. The station at Mount Coke, though often in imminent danger has been preserved. In the Port Natal and Amagula Districts the work of God continues to advance—the latest information from D’Urban circuit, is, on the whole, very cheering.

The cause is prospering at Peiter Maritz-Berg, and other places. The native work in every branch is in a very healthy condition, and in order that it may wax stronger and grow larger, nothing is required but more funds. As this is the case, although we may be perplexed we will not despair, for the Lord is on our side, and the gold and the silver are his.

**WESTERN AFRICA.**—The interesting colony of Sierra Leone continues to advance. In every circuit there has been an increase of members; and the Wesleyan Methodists now constitute the largest of the religious denominations included in the annual census. The intelligence from the Gambia is encouraging; and the reports from the Gold Coast, Ashanti, &c., speak of the continued prosperity of the work in very gratifying terms. A recent letter states—"Never has the work of God in this District been known to assume so cheering an aspect." Glory be to God.

#### AMERICA.

In the latest published report of the Parent Society a very large space is devoted to this section of the great Missionary field. The West Indies particularly have always largely shared in the sympathy of the Committee; and for their civil and religious liberty the British Wesleyans have long and faithfully laboured. The mission for a long period continued in a languishing state, but the servants of the Lord went on, labouring at his command—sowing beside all waters—often sowing in tears, but now they reap in joy, and present their sheaves as offerings unto "the Lord of the harvest."

The accounts from the Antigua and Demerara District call for unfeigned thanks to Almighty God; and in the Jamaica District, although the commercial interest is greatly depressed by the equalisation of the sugar duties, the cause of God advances, and the fruits of its progress are seen and felt in the conversion of souls, and in the enlargement of congregations.

**THE BAHAMA DISTRICT.**—A review of the state of the work in this sphere, affords sufficient evidence that the Lord is in the midst of his people. And in Hayti, notwithstanding much opposition, the word is taking hold of many hearts, and the schools are prospering. With respect to **BRITISH NORTH AMERICA** generally, a great deal is being done among the aboriginals and new settlers, and in the older and more matured districts, the last year has been one of great temporal and spiritual prosperity.

"On thee we humbly wait,  
Our wants are in thy view;  
The harvest, truly, Lord, is great,  
The labourers are few."

### THE NEW BRUNSWICK DISTRICT.

The work in this District is of a very important character, and might be greatly extended if the labourers could be increased, as the wants of a growing population require. New and promising fields of labours are opening in various directions; and although we cannot enter into them all, our ranks have been this year reinforced by the addition of five young men taken out on trial. These have been disposed of in the best possible manner, and it is hoped that the instrumentality of the District thus strengthened, will be commensurately augmented in efficiency and success.

The Conference intend, very soon, perhaps at their next sitting, to form these lower districts into a self-governing and self-sustaining organization,—in short into a CONFERENCE. When this measure is accomplished, *New Brunswick* will be by far the most important section of the Conferential territories. In property—in membership—in the giving habits of the people—in the disposition and general character of the circuits, and in the available resources of the country—in all these respects, and in geographical dimensions, this Province will be the most valuable part of the new *demesne*.

We are not so anxious for independence as we are for the attainment of greater usefulness. We have not grown tired of our subordinate position, or of the Paternal Authority that has been so long, and so kindly exercised over us; but we think the contemplated change will, by God's blessing, promote the extension of METHODISM, and the consequent extension of SCRIPTURAL HOLINESS. For these reasons we would not regret, but rather rejoice, if our next District Meeting should be the last one; and this document, the last report of "*The Wesleyan Methodist Missionary Auxiliary Society for the New Brunswick District.*"

Go from Great Britain, the Metropolis of the Protestant World, and thence, through all the out-posts and Provinces of that world—visit the different mission stations in Europe and America—in Southern and Western Africa—in the West India Islands—in the great Pacific—in New Zealand and Feejee—in Ceylon and Continental India—in the Arctic Circle, and in the Tropics—at the Equator and the Poles,—Perform this tour, and in all of them you'll find it prosecuting its Evangelical labours with patience, industry, and success.

Knowing then, the principles by which it is governed—understanding the motives by which it is influenced—and appreciating the labours in which it is engaged—let us increase her facilities for doing good, by augmenting her funds, and multiplying her agents. The altar in the threshing floor of Ornan the Jebusite—the Ointment that perfumed the house of Simon the Pharisee—and the Widow's mite are all suggestive of liberal things, and show what *Love* can do.

Let us *give*—*give* not as a mere habit—not from a principle of abstract liberality—but from Evangelical motives, and *then* we will be co-workers together with God to promote His Glory, and to accomplish what his servants the Prophets desired and foretold. “His name shall endure forever; his name shall continue as long as the Sun; and men shall be blessed in Him; all nations shall call Him blessed.

ment a high position in the public estimation. And those upon whom  
the management of its affairs has devolved, have been encouraged and stimulated  
to continued efforts to render it, in all its departments, ever  
more efficient. Every year in its history has consequently been  
marked by valuable additions to its educational facilities, and by more or  
less general improvements throughout the Establishment.  
It is especially invited to it as an Institution where the advantages of  
practical training may be obtained in safety and comfort, and  
under favorable circumstances.
