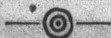

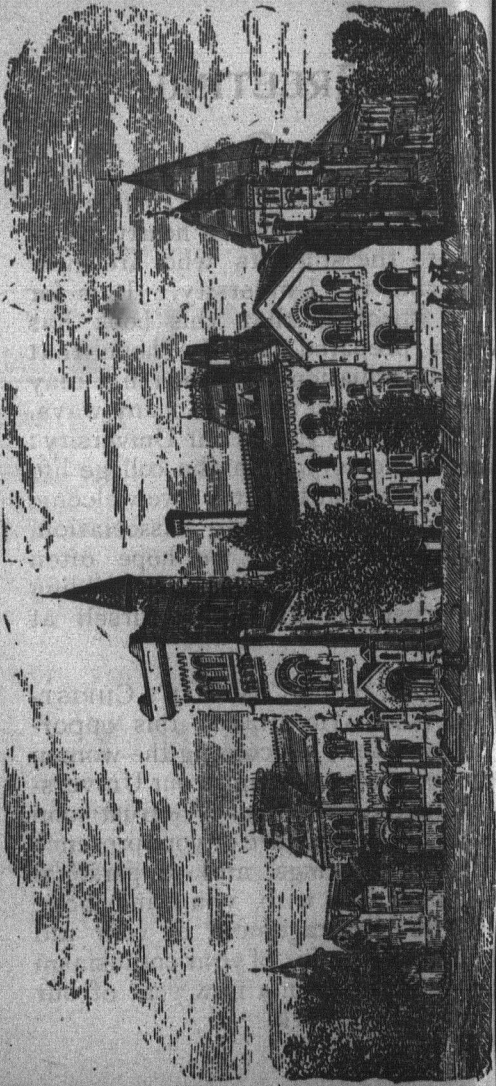

HISTORICAL.



1827.—Royal Charter granted for establishing a state university under the name of King's College.

1842, APRIL 23RD.—Laying of the corner stone of King's College building in Queen's Park.

1843.—Beginning of lectures in faculties of Arts, Medicine and Divinity.

1850, JAN. 1ST.—In accordance with an Act of Parliament the faculty of Divinity ceases to exist, and King's College is transformed into the University of Toronto.

1853.—Faculty of Medicine abolished. University College created, with a teaching faculty in Arts. The University of Toronto retains the power to conduct examinations and to grant degrees.

1854, FEB. 22ND.—Establishment of the Literary and Scientific Society.

1856, OCT. 4TH.—Laying of the corner stone of University College building.

1859, OCT. 4TH.—Placing of the copestone on the turret of the main tower.

1873, MARCH 29TH.—Organization of the Young Men's Christian Association.

1880, OCT. 7TH.—First issue of *The Varsity* under the management of a joint-stock company.

1881.—Establishment of the School of Practical Science, and erection of the building.

1886, MARCH 2ND.—Opening of the Y. M. C. A. Hall.

1887.—University Federation Act, by which the University of Toronto is given teaching faculties in Arts, Medicine, & Law.

1888.—Erection of Biological building on the site of old Moss Hall,

1890, FEB. 14TH.—The University College Fire.

1890, OCT. 7TH.—First issue of *The Varsity* under the management of the Literary and Scientific Society.

1891, JUNE 15TH.—Laying of the corner stone of Victoria College.

1892, MARCH 24TH.—The Young Men's Christian Association incorporated.

1892, APRIL 1ST.—Canadian Colleges' Mission established.

1892, AUG. 6TH.—Death of Sir Daniel Wilson, President of the University.

1892, SEPT. 13TH.—Professor James Loudon, M.A., L.L.D., appointed President.

UNIVERSITY COLLEGE

Young Men's Christian Association

THE OBJECT of the Association shall be to promote growth in grace and Christian fellowship among its members, and aggressive Christian work, especially by and for students; to train them for Christian service; and to lead them to devote their lives to Jesus Christ, not only in distinctive religious callings, but also in secular pursuits.

THE MEMBERS are of two classes—Active and Associate. The first class is composed of members of evangelical churches. Students may be nominated for membership at any regular meeting of the Association.

THE ANNUAL FEE is \$1 for both classes of members.

THE BUILDING is open every day, except Sunday, from 9 a.m. to 6 p.m. Its privileges are open to all members. The reading room is well supplied with newspapers, periodicals and magazines. The parlor is very comfortably furnished; and members will always find at their disposal a piano, an organ, college song books, hymn books, checkers and chess.

THE LIBRARY of the Association is composed chiefly of works on missions. Books will be let out on application to the General Secretary or any member of the Rooms Committee, and should be returned at the end of two weeks.

The Canadian Colleges' MISSION.

In December, 1891, Jas. S. Gale, B.A., who had been our missionary in Korea for two years, severed his connection with the Association. A proposition to unite came from the Mission Board of the Toronto Medical Students' Y. M. C. A. This was accepted and a basis of union agreed upon. Thus was formed on April 1st, 1892, The

Canadian Colleges' Mission, which has grown until at the present time in addition to the original two it includes the University of Toronto Y. W. C. A.; Woman's Medical College Y. W. C. A.; Primary Medical Students' Y. M. C. A.; Normal Students of Toronto; Normal Students of Ottawa; Ontario Agricultural College Y. M. C. A.; Moulton College Y. W. C. A.; McGill College, Montreal, Y. W. C. A.; Ontario Veterinary College Y. M. C. A.; Ontario College of Pharmacy Y. M. C. A.; Coligny College, Ottawa; Ontario Ladies' College, Whitby; Demill College, Oshawa.

The objects of the Mission are twofold:

1. To propagate the Gospel of Christ in Korea and other unevangelized nations.
2. To foster a missionary spirit in Canadian colleges.

The work is under the supervision of a Board composed of representatives of all the Associations concerned.

Dr. R. A. Hardie and wife, who went out to Korea in August, 1890, as the missionaries of the Medical Association, are now the representatives of the Mission. They have proved themselves heroic, self-sacrificing servants of the Gospel, and have endured great hardships in this service.

Dr. Hardie's salary is \$1,200, which is less than that given by any other Board. Last year the amount subscribed was \$1,614.22.

The Doctor is now labouring in Gensan, Korea.

\$2,000 is required to build a house suitable for the work. Of this, \$586.76 has been raised with which a guest chamber for receiving the native Koreans has been built.

Letters from the students are much appreciated by Dr. Hardie. Remember him in your prayers during this time of war in Korea.

Intercollegiate Movement.

Its purposes are threefold :

To bring the students of the world to Christ.

To guard and develop them in Christ.

To send them into the world to work for Christ.

The growth of the movement has been most marked. The first Association was formed in London, in 1844, by George Williams. In America, the first Association was established in Cincinnati in 1848. It is international and interdenominational, and by reason of its broad basis for work and fellowship, the movement has spread rapidly over the whole world. Fourteen years ago the movement included less than 1000 students in twenty-one institutions; to-day it has increased to more than 400 Associations with a membership of over 25,000 students. Asia has over fifty Associations; Africa twelve; New Zealand and Hawaiian Islands four each.

The movement is directed from New York City as headquarters. The Executive Committee consists of thirty-nine regular members, fifty-nine advisory and corresponding members, and a Board of fifteen Trustees. Under the direction of the Committee, twenty office and travelling secretaries and a corps of general agents, devote a whole or a portion of their time to the work.

For the direction of this work which calls for about \$80,000 annually, the committee is dependent upon voluntary contributions.

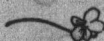

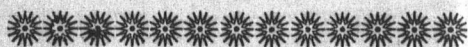
