INDIANS VISITING PORT DOVER A. D., 1670 FOR PLEASURE, IS SO STATED BY THE FRENCH MISSIONARIES,

FRANCOIS DOLLIER and DEGALINEE, who with seven other Frenchmen took possession of the lands of Lake Erie, October, A. D. 1669, in the name of King Louis XIV of France, and wintered a short distance north of our harbor.

On Passion Sunday, 1670, they made and planted a cross about where the harbor now is and attached to it the arms of France. They named this vicinity the Paradise of Canada on account of its health, beauty and productiveness.

The indians have vanished, the woodlands have disappeared, but the beautiful winding hills and grain clad fields, the healthy atmosphere and laughting waters remain with us for the benefit of the health and pleasure seeker, for those it is yet the Paradise of Canada-










