

#### ARTICLES OF THE CALENDAR

-AND-

#### ASTRONOMICAL NOTICES FOR THE YEAR 1895.

On the left hand page of each month are given the rising and setting of the Sun and the length of the day to the nearest full minute; also the data required for solar observations, namely the Equation of Time, (that is the difference between variable Sun Time and uniform Clock Time), to be added or substracted according as the one is behind or ahead of the other, which is given for the instant of Apparent Noon. Next is the Sun's Declination at Mean Noon, Greenwich Time. With these exceptions all the calculations are reduced to the nearest minute of Local Mean Time at Charlottetown (Latitude 46° 13′ 55″ N., Long-titude 93° 7′ 33″ W.; giving 4hs. 12 mins. 29.5 sec. difference slow on Greenwich.

If required, the Sun's Declination at Greenwich apparent noon may be found from the data here given by multiplying the hourly variation by the Equation of Time for the same day reduced to the decimal of an hour, and applying the result according to the conditions as under.

From the Sun's apparent semi-diameter, which is given daily to the nearest tenth of a second, may be found the Sun's Horizontal Parallax (that is what would be the Earth's apparant semi-diameter as seen from the distance of the Sun, by dividing by 107.44, the proportion the Sun's actual diameter bears to that of the Earth). Thus we find for July when the Sun's distance is greatest  $\frac{15^{4}6^{\circ}}{107.44} - \frac{946}{1074} = 8^{\circ}.806$  for Parallax and also on December 31st, when the Sun is nearest the semi-diameter is 16′ 18″ 2 giving 9′.105 for Parallax.

On the right hand page of each month are given the phases of the Moon, its Rising, Southing and Setting, with the time of High Water at Charlottetown, to the nearest full minute of local mean time.

To assist in weather forecasts, are added the Moon's Perigee and Apogee, and the time of crossing the Equator and reaching its greatest North and South Declination. It having been observed that these periods are generally found to be accompanied by atmospheric changes more or less marked as they agree with the Moon's changes and Perigee, when two or more of these influences concur within the space of 48 hours it is indicated by \*\* or \*\*\* accordingly.

#### ECLIPSES.

During the year 1895, there will be five Eclipses, three of the Sun and two of the Moon, only the latter will be observable at Charlottetown. They are as follows:—

- (I) A Total Eclipse of the Moon, March 10th, Greenwich mean time of opposition 15 hrs. 31 mins. 30 sec. (March 11th day, 3 hrs. 31.30 sec. a. m.)
- (II) A Partial Eclipse of the Sun, Greenwich mean time of conjunction March 25th, 23 hrs. 36 mins, 49.8 sec. (11h. 36m. 46m. a. m., March 26th), visible in Greenland, Iceland, west coast of Norway, ending at Charlottetown just about sunrise.
- (III) A Partial Eclipse of the Sun, Greenwich mean time of conjunction August 20th, 0 hrs. 15 mins. 6 sec. only visible in Russia and western parts of Central Asia.
- (IV) A Total Eclipse of the Moon, September 3rd, Greenwich mean time of opposition 17 hrs. 47 mins.  $50.4~{\rm sec.}=5~{\rm hrs.}$  47 mins.  $58~{\rm sec.}$ , a. m.
- (V) A Partial Eclipse of the Sun September 18th, Greenwich mean time of conjunction 9 hrs. 49 mins. 21.7 sec., visible in New Zealand and South Pacific Ocean, only partially in the morning on the eastern coast of Australia.

  - Last contact of Chadow, March 12th, 1h. 12m., a. m. Last contact of Penumbra, 2h. 17.5m.


First contact of the Moon with the Shadow on the East 127° from the North Point.

Last contact on the West side 699 from the North Point.

- IV Partial Eclipse of the Moon September 3rd:
  - First contact with Penumbra, 10h. 36.2m., p.
  - Shadow. 0h. 47.8m., midnight.
  - Total from 0h. 54.4m. a.m., Sept. 4th
    - till 2h. 34m., a.m.
    - Last contact with Shadow 3h. 41m., a. m. End of Eclipse, 4h. 51m., a. m.
- First contact with the Shadow on the East 540 from the North Point.

Last contact on the West side 1100 from the North Point.

The passage of the Moon through the Earth's Shadow during the Eclipses of March 10th and September 3rd, 1895. For the latter case the Moon is left in outline.



Note.—Both Eclipses are drawn to the same scale, the only difference being that on Sept. 3rd, the Moon (being then in Apogee and at its least apparent diameter) at the instant of contact with the Shadow is entirely within the limits of the Penumbra.

#### THE PLANETS.

MERCURY commences this year as a morning star with direct motion, and will be alternately retrogade and direct between the following dates:—February 15th, March 8th, June 18th, October 14th, November 5th and the end of the year. The only chance for finding this planet will be about the dates of its greatest elongation east or west of the Sun as an evening or a morning star. February 9th, 18° E.; March 23rd, 27° W.; June 4th, 13° E.; July 22nd, 19° W.; October 1st, 25° E.; November 10th, 19° W.

VENUS will be an evening star till September, reappearing as a morning star after her inferior conjunction with the Sun Sept. 18th. Her motion with reference to the Ecliptic will be direct till August 27th, retrograde till October 8th, and direct till the end of the year.

Mars will be an evening star till October. After his conjunction with the Sun on the 10th of that month he will reappear as a morning star. His apparent motion will be direct throughout the year. He will come in conjunction with the other planets in the following order: Neptune, March 25th; Jupiter, April 25; Venus, June 4th; Mercury, August 31st; Venus, Sept. 10th; Mercury, Oct. 29th and Nov. 22nd; Venus 10, Saturn Nov. 16th; in Uranus Nov. 27.

JUPITER will be an evening star till the end of June, as a morning star after his conjunction with the Sun July 10th, and so continue to the end of the year. His conjunctions with the other planets will be Mars, April 5th; Venus, May 10th; Mercury, June 18th, 25th, and August 1st.

SATURN will be a morning star till his opposition to the Sun April 23rd, an evening star till his conjunction November 4th, an evening star to the end of the year, his apparent orbit motion direct till Feb. 14th. retrograde till July 5th, and direct to the end of the year. His planetary conjunctions will be with Mercury, October 8th, 17th and Nov. 20th, and with Mars November 16th.

URANUS will be a near companion to Saturn throughout the year, gradually approaching from 9° 45′ to the east in January to 8° 30′ December 31st. His conjunction will be with the Sun November 16th; Mercury, November 26th; Mars, Nov. 29th, and Venus, December 28th.

NEPTUNE commences the year as an evening star about 17° to the west of Jupiter, which he accompanies throughout the year, direct distance gradually increasing to 54° at the end of the year. He will be an evening star till the end of May, a morning star during the remainder. His conjunctions are with

Mars, March 25th; Venus, April, 29th, and Mercury, May 29th. The only chance for finding this minute planet will be at thouse of his conjunction with Mars, when he will be 3° (about 6 moon's diameter) to the south of that planet.

#### OCCULTATIONS OF PLANETS BY THE MOON.

Of these there will be but two during the year, but neither favorable for observation. They are Mercury, March 23rd, 5h. 4m. p. m. Venus, June 25th, 12h. 0m. navigation.

The time of High Water at Charlottetown is given to the nearest minute of local mean time once in 24 hours. To find an intervening tide, all that is needed is to take half the sum of the adjacent tides, before and after, changing morning to afternoon, or the reverse, as required.

Example to find the tide Morning May 15th,-

May 14th, 3h. 7m., Afternoon. May 15th, 4h. 5m., Afternoon.


