I examined the watch-case rooms.— Every case is composed of more than thirty parts. In the lower rooms the bars are melted; and,—to be brief,— after a great variety of processes up stairs and down, they are rapidly turned out the models of beauty and elegance that we take to our homes and our bosoms. The different parts are soldered together under little French-like roofs, which ex-tend along the benches and prevent the room from being begrimed with smoke. Workmen, after tying two parts together with wires, fuse them by suddenly light-ing up a tube, almost exactly like a snake which instantly spils out a stream of fire, and playes on the detached parts until they are welded—"now and for ever, one and inseparable."
