

The United Wesley n Methodist Church of Canada.

The United Wesley a Methodist Church of Canada. The first General Conference of the united Methodist bodies in the Dominion of Canada met for business in the Metropolitan Wesleyan Church, Toronto, on Wednesday morning at 10 o'clock. This new Conference is, by its provision-al constitution, at present limited to 220 members, comprising an equal number of ministers and lay men. These delegates have already been elected by ballo - the ministerial by ministers at their late An-nual Conferences, and the lay by lay anen at their recent District Mechangs. They represent a wide field of occupancy ; yoning, as we find them, from Ontario, Quebec, British Columbia, Manitola, New Brunswick, Nova Socia, Cape Ber-ton, Prince Edward Island, and New-onaland. The proportion of representatives in the General Conference is at the rate of one minister and one layman for every eight ordained ministers in the several bodies now amalgamet. The motion, the Hon, Mr. Wilmot, ex-fovermor of New Brunswick, Nava sunai-mously chosen chairman *pro ten*; and the Rev. Alexander Sutherland and Mr. Benjamin Hopkins were appointed Secre-taria. The 37th Hymn was sung, and the exxii.

Governor Willmot made a few remarks, a anking his brethren for the honor con-ferred upon him. He anticipated a pleas-ant and harmonions time, and he trusted that the Divine blessing would richly rest down upon them and their deliberation The Conference adjourned shortly aft. 11 o'clock, Rev. Dr. Douglas closing with prayer.
