Of course it is a heavy job, but all the same it is excessively disagreeable to the average housekeeper to drag back his barrel of refuse into his woodshed because the foreman happened to fail to check off his men. Then, in the cost of scavenging, something Then, in the cost of scavenging, something must be done to control it. Here is a table giving the figures of the cost of this par-cicular departmen of the City Commissioner's

In justice to the City Commissioner it must be remarked that within three years wages have jumped up from \$1.15 to \$1.50 a day and hired horses and carts from \$2 to \$2.50, and in addition the hours of labor were reduced from 10 to 9 per diem. Now letting the matter out by contract relieve the city from all responsibility. It makes an individual responsible, who, on the principle of self-preservation, will see that there is no skipping the work. The system that has worked successfully in Montreal must perforce work successfully here. Those who know the trouble the Local Board of Health and Markets and License Committee have had in this connection will readily admit the advantages of having this work done by contract.

the trouble in connection with pay sheets, the loss in horseflesh, etc. All these by no means inconsiderable items can be swept away and help not a little to simplify the civic machine. Now, so far there have been two methods of disposing of the nigh soil said scavenger refuse of the city suggested. The first is by the city erecting its own crematories for both, and continuing upon the present lines. This means not only an appropriation of at least \$60,000 for 1891, but the cost of erecting three crematories, two for house refuse and on for night soil. This cannot cost less than an additional \$35,000. The second proposition is the one presented based on the Montreal system. The parties tendering will have to erect their own crematories, provide their own sites, and take over the city plant at a valuation if so desired This they will do at an annual appropriation of \$72,000, or \$6000 monthly, with a 5 per cent, increase yearly during the continuance of the contract. If the city increases as rapidly from 1891 to 1896 as it had done from 1897 to 1890 it will be easily seen which system is the more advantageous. Let who will get tile contract for this kind of work contract it must be. There are too many dirty langs in the city now to let maiters remain in their present shape much longer.
