Whence doubts have arisen as to the kind or class of instruments included in the term "cheque" used in the sixth section of the Act 42 Vic. The Law of Window Lights.

WHEN CAN A MAN LAWFULLY SHUT OFF THE LIGHT FROM HIS NEIGHBOR'S WINDOW?

There has been a great deal of litigation both in England and the United States on the subject of window lights, and the right of one property owner to secure unobstructed light and air over the property of another.

Of course, if land has been sold at an open auction, the purchaser takes the land as he finds it, and the owner of the land cannot complain if the purchaser does not object to the condition of the land.

A leading case in New York is that of Parker v. Fiske. It is much surprising that an owner of land could be maintained against another on the ground that the latter had planted trees which he planted on the opposite side of the street, and that the trees were so placed as to obstruct the light and air over the property of the plaintiff.

It is a well established principle, that if a person has a right to light and air over his property, he is entitled to have it, and the law will not allow it to be taken away from him. The law will not allow a person to build a wall or to plant trees in such a way as to obstruct the light and air over his neighbor's property.
