The approach from the westward has undergone a like change for the better, and was used on a particular description of it. In the year before referred to, (1877) there were no approaches to the town from the west.

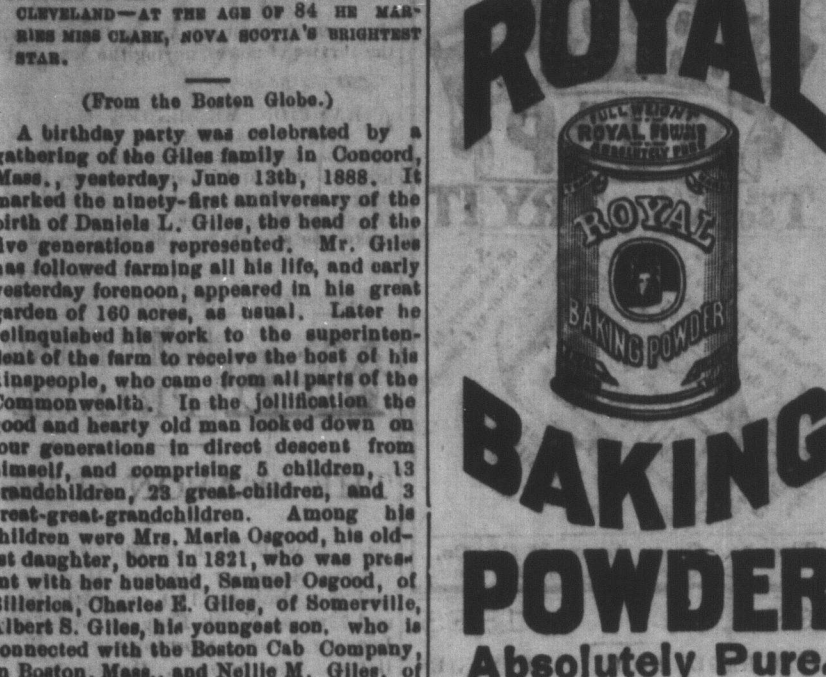
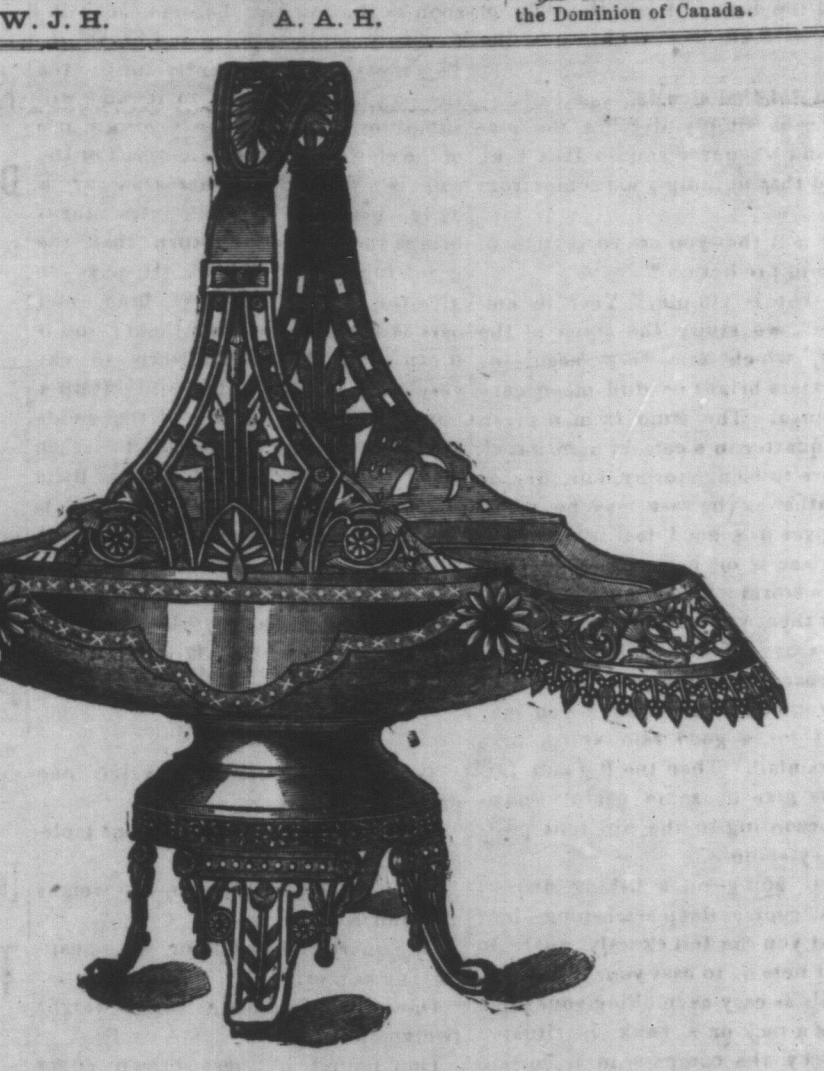
